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'ONEVOICE27' - A GLOBAL EVANGELISM INITIATIVE



OneVoice27: Mission for All is a global evangelistic initiative designed to unite all media platforms, local congregations, and individual members in a synchronized gospel outreach effort.

OneVoice27: Mission for All is a global evangelistic initiative designed to unite all media platforms, local congregations, and individual members in a synchronized gospel outreach effort.

Timed to commemorate approximately 2,000 years since Jesus' baptism and the beginning of His earthly ministry, the initiative will be executed under the unifying theme "All Things New: Hope Starts Here." The mission seeks to connect the broad reach of digital and broadcast media with meaningful and personal engagement across more than 180,000 local congregations. All congregations will be mobilized to proclaim the Everlasting Gospel with clarity, creativity, consistency and a unified voice.

What is OneVoice27?

OneVoice27 focuses on total member involvement and relational discipleship. It operates on a three-step strategy:

1. **Reach:** This step seeks to leverage social media, television, radio, websites, podcasts, livestreams and print to saturate digital and physical spaces with messages focused on Christ. The objective is to reach people wherever they are and introduce them to the message that Jesus transforms lives and makes all things new.

2. **Engage:** In this step, the objective is to move audiences from digital, passive viewership into

meaningful interaction and personal relationships through online Bible studies, prayer requests, and community-building initiatives. Media content should therefore include clear invitations and opportunities for audiences to connect and respond.

3. **Connect:** This strategy is to connect with audiences by routing digital interest directly to local Adventist churches for personal Bible study, small group involvement, and long-term mentorship. It is important to remember that Jesus the Messiah is the central theme of the OneVoice27 initiative. As such, every message, programme, production, series, outreach and engagement should point to HIM!

Key Timeline

Here are the important dates associated with the initiative:

1. **September 5, 2026 — Global Launch:** This date signals an official worldwide push across digital and broadcast channels. This coordinated push will introduce the initiative, establish global awareness, and invite churches, members, and media ministries to become actively involved.

2. **2026–2027 — Preparation & Mobilization:** During this period, local congregations and members

should undergo training in digital evangelism, friendship ministry, content creation and storytelling, response management and follow-up, social media management and Bible study leadership.

3. August – September 2027 — Culminating Global Harvest: This initiative will culminate in synchronized global reaping meetings, local public evangelism events, and widespread digital outreach campaigns across every church division.

How Members Can Get Involved

The success of OneVoice27 relies heavily on individual member participation rather than relying solely on church administrators or media networks. Every member is invited to take part in three main areas:

1. Spiritual Preparation

United Prayer: Participate in corporate and personal prayer initiatives focused on seeking the outpouring of the Holy Spirit.

Focused Study: Engage in devotional study of the life of Christ—particularly reading *The Desire of Ages*—and explore biblical prophecies in Daniel and Revelation.

2. Digital & Media Ambassadors

Share Hope Online: Share, like, and distribute official All Things New videos, graphics, and articles across personal social media platforms.

Content Creation: Young adults and digital creators are encouraged to produce authentic, culturally relevant testimonies and short-form video content that points viewers to Christ.

3. Local Community Engagement

Missional Small Groups: Host or join small group Bible studies, home fellowships, or community interest groups.

Relational Ministry: Engage in “friendship evangelism” by volunteering in local community service projects, health ministries, and welcoming people who connect with the church through online channels.

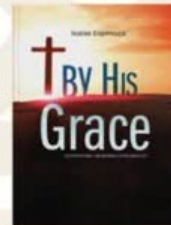
Conclusion

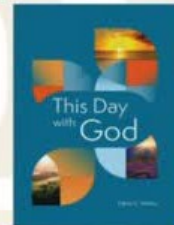

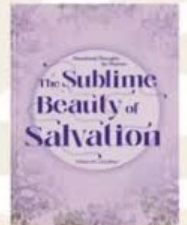

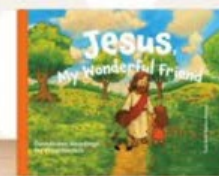

200+ CHILDREN BENEFIT FROM LUCEA TREAT & HEALTH FAIR

LUCEA, Hanover — While back-to-school treats have long been a staple of Lucea Seventh-day Adventist Church's community outreach, this year marks the first time the congregation integrated a full-scale health fair into the annual event.

The church grounds were a hive of activity Wednesday, as approximately 215 children between the ages 3 -17 and more than 180 adults from across Hanover received school supplies and medical services valued at more than \$600,000.

Recipients and parents expressed profound gratitude, expressing delight with the quality and practical relevance of the educational items and medical attention received between the hours of 8:30 am and 3:30 pm.

It was obvious that a lot of planning went into the day's activities. There were customised packages structured according to students' educational level, spanning early childhood, primary, high school, and tertiary studies. There were also practitioners on site to perform mandatory school medical examinations and administer required immunisations to ensure students are fully prepared for the upcoming academic year. The event was conceptualised and executed by the church's health department — directed by Kerriann Campbell-Matherson — and the education department which is led by Aleisha Smith-Grant.

"We know that back-to-school is usually one of those times when parents are financially stressed, and so this is our way of alleviating the stress as it relates to back-to-school stationery," Smith-Grant told attendees.

"So today, we're going to be handing out different types of stationery, and we do hope that it will help to offset some of what it is that you will have to spend on your students going back to school," she said.

Simultaneously, there were critical clinical screenings and medical checks for the adults. There were a wide range of free diagnostic and preventative healthcare services, including checks for blood pressure, blood sugar, cholesterol, body mass index (BMI) calculations, in addition to confidential HIV and syphilis testing.

"A voluntary blood donation drive was also hosted in partnership with health officials," Campbell-Matherson shared with the Jamaica Observer.

"While the drive yielded two successful donations, we must note that there is an urgent need for citizens across the parish to donate regularly to support local health services."

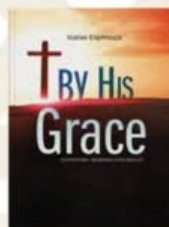

Organisers expressed sincere gratitude to dedicated volunteers, health and education committees, community members, presenters, and sponsors who made the event possible.

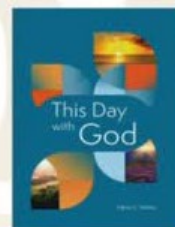

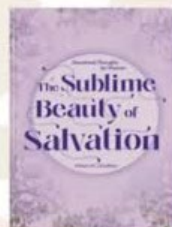

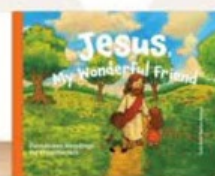

NEWS FROM THE INTER-AMERICAN DIVISION

At SeLD, Adventist Leaders Prepare to Turn Lessons Into Mission

Participants say the three-day gathering reshaped how they plan to lead people, institutions, and ministry across Inter-America.

Laura Acosta will return to Colombia determined to develop every member of her communication team as a leader. In Mexico, Robert González will keep testing every institutional plan against one question: Does it advance the church's mission? Kay White from the Caribbean Union region is preparing to help local members reconnect with people who have drifted from church life. And Rosario González de Santamaría in Panama, wants to step away from paperwork more often so she can listen more closely to teachers and students.

They serve in four different ministry settings, but as the 2026 Segment Leadership Development (SeLD) Conference concluded in Panama City, each described a similar shift: Christian leadership is not simply about a title or a set of responsibilities. It is about developing people, listening with humility, and keeping mission at the center of every decision.

Nearly 700 Seventh-day Adventist administrators, departmental directors, pastors, educators, institutional leaders, and lay leaders attended the July 27–29 conference in person, while more than 800 others joined online. Held under the theme “Building Capacity to Fulfill the Mission,” the three-day gathering combined plenary presentations with specialized tracks on leadership, mission, governance, digital transformation, innovation, discipleship, and other issues confronting the church today.

Developing Leaders Through Communication

For Acosta, who has served in church communication since 2018 and was recently appointed associate communication director for the South Colombia Union in Bogotá, the conference reframed familiar leadership principles within a distinctly Adventist context. She has completed leadership training outside the church, she said, but SeLD's emphasis on dependence on the Holy Spirit reshaped how she views people, projects, and strategy.

One statement stayed with her: "As leaders, we are not defined by how we arrive, but by how we leave." It prompted her to reflect not only on what she will accomplish in her current role, but on the team and ministry she will leave behind.

Acosta leads a seven-member communication team. Before SeLD, she said, leadership often felt centered on one person directing others. She now intends to be more intentional about developing each team member as a leader in their own area.

"They are not only doing technical work," she said. "Through photography, video, and writing, they are also making disciples."

That perspective is increasingly important as the church expands its digital mission. Acosta noted that online initiatives can generate hundreds of spiritual interests in minutes—far more than a

local congregation may be prepared to receive at once. Her union already operates radio, television, and digital platforms, but the next challenge is ensuring that those requesting prayer or Bible studies are personally followed up and connected to a local church.

The OneVoice27 emphasis presented at SeLD gave her team a clearer framework for that follow-up, she said. It also reinforced her conviction that communication must extend beyond studios and content production. "Communication is evangelism," Acosta said. "It is a ministry."

Keeping Institutions Centered on Mission

González, general director of the Vida Sana Center (Health and Lifestyle Center) in Chiapas, Mexico, left SeLD with a renewed conviction that institutional growth must never become disconnected from the church's purpose.

"We are an arm of the church," he said. "We are here to fulfill the mission of the church, which is God's mission."

The health center has expanded its staff and patient care in recent years and is planning a clinic dedicated to diabetes treatment and prevention. For González, that growth makes careful strategic planning increasingly important while reinforcing the need to define success in spiritual as well as operational terms.

He described patients who arrive in severe pain, unable to sleep or eat, and later leave with renewed strength and hope. Every therapy, treatment, and interaction should point patients toward God while helping them adopt a healthier way of life, he said.

A MISTAKE NOT TO MAKE

DID YOU KNOW?

Did you know that making just one single mistake at the very finish line cost Moses his lifelong dream of entering the Promised Land—yet God's grace still awarded him a higher home in heaven?

In this powerful sermon, "A Mistake Not to Make," the focus centers on the tragic narrative of Numbers 20, where Moses let frustration, grief, and the murmuring of the Israelites push him into striking the rock at Kadesh instead of speaking to it as God had commanded. After forty years of faithful leadership, Moses yielded to anger, claimed divine credit by asking, "Must we fetch you water out of this rock?", and misrepresented God's character. By striking the rock a second time, he symbolically distorted the gospel message—that Christ, the true Rock, was to be struck only once for humanity's sins, after which believers need only speak to Him in prayer. The message serves as a solemn warning that proximity to the Promised Land demands greater vigilance, as spiritual complacency, self-reliance, and speaking out of turn can lead to costly failures even when doing the right work.

However, the ultimate takeaway of the sermon transcends human frailty by pointing directly to the boundless, redemptive grace of God. Although Moses faced the earthly consequence of missing physical Canaan, his sincere repentance allowed God to raise him from Mount Nebo and translate him directly to the heavenly Canaan, where he later appeared alongside Elijah on the Mount of Transfiguration to encourage Christ. The sermon reminds believers that while sin carries real consequences and good past deeds cannot cover present disobedience, human salvation is never earned through perfection, genetics, or personal righteousness. Rather, it is secured solely through total trust in Christ, demonstrating that no mistake is too great for God's grace to redeem when a heart is truly surrendered.

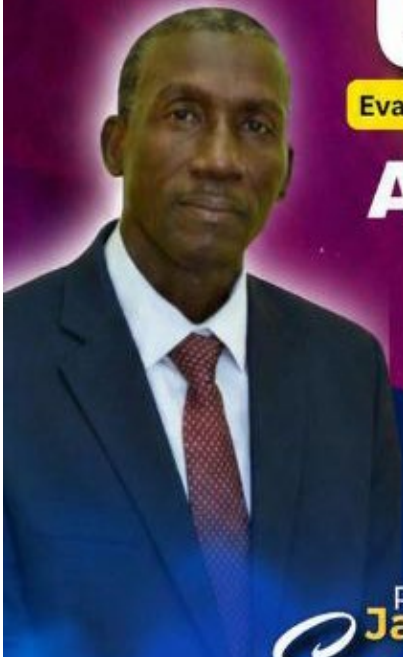
