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# MISSION OF HOPE: FLORIDA VOLUNTEERS RESTORE DARLISTON PREPARATORY FOLLOWING HURRICANE MELISSA DEVASTATION

**D**ARLISTON, Westmoreland — What began as an initial relief response following the devastating impacts of Hurricane Melissa has blossomed into a transformative, multi-agency mission project for Darliston Seventh-day Adventist Preparatory School.

The initiative first took root following preliminary damage assessments conducted in November 2025, shortly after the storm. In response, international non-profit Restore a Child—in partnership with the Palm Springs Seventh-day Adventist Church in Florida—travelled to the island in March 2026. Upon seeing the devastation firsthand, the team immediately stepped in to replace the school's damaged front entrance doors, an act that quickly revealed how much more assistance the campus required.

Determined to make a lasting impact, a collaborative mission team organized a return trip from July 18 to 24, 2026. An 18-member volunteer team, including 10 youth Pathfinders from the Palm Springs Soaring Eagles Pathfinder Club, travelled to Jamaica under the spiritual leadership of district pastor, Pastor Omar Palmer, to support and uplift the community of Darliston.

Pastor Omar Palmer highlighted the selfless dedication behind the youth involvement:

"The Pathfinder club chose to forgo their summer trip to Disney, deciding instead to channel their resources toward coming to Jamaica," Pastor Palmer shared. "We decided to return to Darliston to address the ongoing needs. Our church members, Restore a Child—our longtime partner led by Norma Nashed, which operates orphanages worldwide—and Advent Health Prestige Care, a mental health organization operated by my wife, Sheryl Palmer, all rallied together to fundraise. We came back to Jamaica determined to do even more."

During the week-long mission trip, the volunteer team executed major structural, aesthetic, and community upgrades across the school and surrounding areas.

Volunteers cleared roads for improved playfield access, graded the area, and added fresh topsoil to the back playground. Additionally, they completely paved the front quadrangle, creating a dual-purpose space that now serves as a secure parking lot and a dedicated play area for the students.

Two primary classrooms inside the school underwent complete interior resurfacing and retiling. The team also installed interior and exterior lighting and replaced additional doors throughout the campus.

The team hosted a Back-to-School giveaway, distributing more than 150 school supply packages containing bags, books, and essential items to children across the Darliston community.

"We are deeply grateful to Pastor Omar Palmer and the Palm Springs Soaring Eagles Pathfinder Club for their incredible work at Darliston Seventh-day Adventist Preparatory School," said Mrs. Keisha Allen, Education Director of the West Jamaica Conference. "From tiling classrooms and installing lighting to donating doors and clearing roads for the playfield, their efforts have vastly improved our campus ahead of the September term. The back-to-school supplies they shared also brought immense joy to our wider community. We treasure this partnership and look forward to working together to uplift more schools across the constituency."

Reflecting on the journey's spiritual impact, Sheffian Romany, Associate Pathfinder Director of the Palm Springs Soaring Eagles Club, shared that the project served as a powerful reminder of God's active presence. She noted that showing Christ's love and offering encouragement to families facing hardship brought genuine hope, adding that seeing lives touched through compassionate service strengthened her faith and demonstrated how willing hands can make a lasting difference.

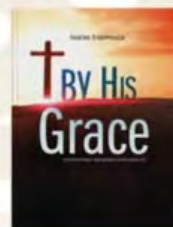
For the young volunteers, the intensive physical labor proved to be a deeply rewarding spiritual experience.

"Our Pathfinders felt renewed and deeply energized. To see those young people working inside Darliston Prep late into the night at 11:00 p.m.—lifting tiles and giving everything they had while singing and praising together—was a remarkable experience," Pastor Omar Palmer added. "To Pastor Rose and the entire leadership team at the West Jamaica Conference: we are your partners, and we will continue to do whatever we can for the glory of God."

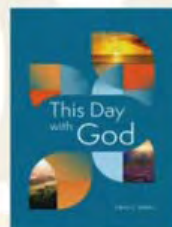

## JAMAICA NEEDS 'A NEW KIND OF EMANCIPATION', SAYS PASTOR BREVITT

As Jamaicans prepare to celebrate Emancipence 2026, outspoken Seventh-day Adventist pastor Charles Brevitt is challenging the nation to pursue a new kind of emancipation – one that frees citizens from violence, moral decay, greed and spiritual complacency.

“We need a new kind of emancipation,” said Brevitt, while delivering the sermon at the St James Municipal Corporation’s Emancipation and Independence Church Service, held at the Norwood Seventh-day Adventist Church on Saturday.

“How did we get to the point where a brother takes a gun and blows off his brother’s head? We didn’t get here overnight. The signs and warnings were always on the wall,” he added.

Using Psalm 126 as a point of reference and drawing on the theme ‘United in Celebrating Resilience’, Brevitt said Jamaica’s observance of Emancipation and Independence should inspire not only national pride, but also personal transformation.

“The only reason we got Emancipation and Independence is because somebody dreamed an impossible dream,” he said. “Don’t roll over and play dead. If God allows you to get into it, he will allow you to get out of it.”

Drawing parallels between biblical Israel’s return from Babylonian captivity and Jamaica’s current challenges, Brevitt said Psalm 126 offers assurance that God can restore even the bleakest situations.

“When the Lord restored the fortunes of Zion, we were like those who dreamed ... . The Lord has done great things for us, and we are filled with joy,” he quoted from the Bible, noting that the Psalm reminds believers that suffering is temporary.

“Those who sow in tears shall reap with songs of joy. Dreaming, in the text, is a pushback and resilience against cynics who have great doubt,” he said. “When you are down to nothing, God is up to something, because nothing is the raw material with which he works.”

Brevitt also challenged Jamaicans to move beyond what he called superficial patriotism.

“We come with a smirk on our face and our fake nationalism. But I’m telling you, if our ancestors who fought for and obtained Emancipation and Independence were thinking like us, we would still be where they were,” he declared.

Encouraging the congregation to dream beyond their present circumstances, he said: “Dream with a godlike cause, nothing is impossible.

“Let us dream while we are wide awake. Dream of a faith that will not shrink. Dream of the unity of the brotherhood in the faith. Dream of earning a decent and liveable wage,” he added.

Brevitt also warned against pride, materialism and the pursuit of status at the expense of compassion.

“We must not think more highly of ourselves than we

ought. The Lord has a way of cutting us back down to size," he said, using Hurricane Melissa as an example of life's uncertainty.

"Two days before Melissa there were people who were on cloud nine, and two days after Melissa they didn't even know where the cloud was, much more to count nine. So don't become intoxicated by riches or position."

Brevitt went on to condemn violence, and urged those facing hardship not to lose hope.

"Do not give way to despair because of how people treat you. God specialises in reversals," he said, referencing the Apostle Peter's miraculous release from prison in Acts 12 and reminding worshippers that no situation is beyond God's power.

"If God could close the lions' mouths for Daniel, part the Red Sea for Israel, open the prison for Peter and bring Israel back from captivity, dream impossible dreams," he said.

He also appealed for reconciliation and forgiveness as the nation marks its 64th year of Independence.

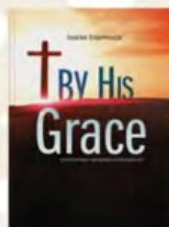
"We are not going to continue this year on bad terms with anybody. If you have done me wrong, you are forgiven. If I have done you wrong, I hope you will forgive me. I am moving on in positivity," he said.

"Never be ashamed of what you are going through. God will use your story for His glory. Let us dream while we are wide awake."

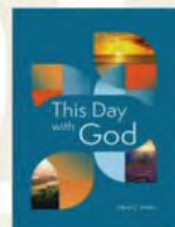

# At SeLD, Adventist Leaders Urged to Lead Churchwide Mobilization for OneVoice27

Leaders prepare churches for a united evangelistic movement beginning Sept. 5.

**H**undreds of Seventh-day Adventist administrators, department directors, pastors, educators and lay leaders from across the Inter-American Division (IAD) were challenged to mobilize their territories for OneVoice27, a global evangelistic initiative uniting media outreach, Bible study and local church evangelism to share the message of Jesus Christ.

The initiative was presented to nearly 700 leaders attending the Inter-American Division's Segment Leader Development (SeLD) Conference in Panama City on July 28, with hundreds more participating online. Leaders were urged to prepare churches and institutions for the official Sept. 5 launch of OneVoice27, leading to a worldwide evangelistic emphasis culminating in September 2

## One Church, One Evangelistic Focus

Pastor Jim Howard, president of Adventist World Radio and a member of the OneVoice27 steering committee, said the initiative allows each division, union and local territory to develop strategies suited to its context while uniting the world church around common evangelistic priorities.

"I want to talk to you about leading OneVoice27," Howard said, urging administrators to move the initiative beyond committees and institutions to pastors, local church leaders and members. He encouraged territories to use the coming months to prepare congregations, mobilize members and expand media outreach through Adventist media organizations, local churches and individual members.

The initiative will use radio, television, publishing, websites and social media to reach spiritually interested people through both church media ministries and local congregations.

"We have the privilege of meeting people where they are through media and technology like never before," Howard said.

## Preparing Churches for Follow-up

For public audiences, the evangelistic emphasis will center on the Messiah under the message "All Things New—Hope Starts Here." Howard explained that 2027 marks 2,000 years since A.D. 27, the year Adventists understand from Daniel 9 as the beginning of Jesus' public ministry.

"This is a wonderful opportunity for us to connect the church's prophetic understanding while pointing people to Jesus Christ, who is the heart and core of our message," he said.

Howard said media can identify spiritually interested people on an unprecedented scale, but disciple-making ultimately depends on personal relationships.

"There are two parts to OneVoice27," he said. "The first is to find and develop spiritually interested people. The second is personal follow-up. Only in-person disciple making will truly make disciples." He urged administrators to prepare churches for growing Bible study interest by training members and strengthening local Bible study ministries.

"If OneVoice27 is just about media, then we will do more harm than good," Howard said. "It's the in-person Bible studies and campaigns that will bring us face to face with those interested people."

Howard said the church is developing Global Bible School, a digital platform that will guide people through Bible studies via WhatsApp before connecting interested participants with nearby Adventist congregations for personal follow-up. OneVoice27 will also emphasize 40 days of prayer, reading *The Desire of Ages*, studying Daniel and Revelation, and new evangelistic resources centered on Christ.

## DID YOU KNOW?

that the phrase “**Beast Mode**”—a term we use to describe fictional characters powering up, athletes dominating the field, or superheroes like the Incredible Hulk unleashing raw, unstoppable rage—actually **exposes one of the greatest spiritual dangers facing God’s people today?**

While pop culture treats going “beast mode” as the ultimate power move, Scripture reveals a sobering truth: when we allow our unbridled passions, worldly pleasures, and selfish pride to drive us, **we stop reflecting the image of God and start taking on the character of a beast.**

Throughout history, people have had a dangerous habit of letting the beast within take over. As we wait for the return of Jesus Christ, the final conflict of Revelation isn’t just about avoiding a future external system or mark; it is about slaying the beast within our own hearts.

True worshippers in these last days are those who resist the pull of the flesh, remain obedient to all of God’s commandments, and patiently endure without letting impatience, compromise, or bitterness shape their character before the Savior appears.

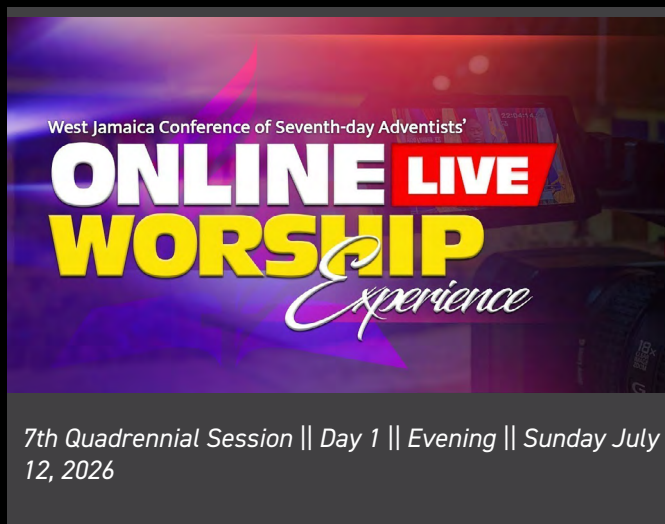
