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SDA CHURCH IN ANCHOVY MARKS 40 YEARS OF MINISTRY WITH CALL TO UNITY AND FAITHFULNESS

ANCHOVY, St. James

The Seventh-day Adventist Church, Anchovy recently celebrated its 40th anniversary with a weekend of worship, reflection, and thanksgiving as members, former pastors, and church leaders honoured four decades of ministry under the theme, "Resilient in Trials, Growing in Grace, Going Home in Victory."

The main anniversary service on Sabbath, August 1, 2026, brought together former and current members, church leaders, and guests in celebration of the congregation's rich history and enduring mission. Greetings and testimonies were shared by Elder C. Lettman and Pastors Joel Haye, Leroy Miller, Maurice McGhie, Christopher Harvey, and Hector Kaden. Congratulatory remarks were also delivered by Pastor Donovan Williams, Vice President of the West Jamaica Conference, and Pastor Glen Samuels, President of the Jamaica Union Conference.

The anniversary sermon was delivered by Dr. Burnett Robinson, who conducted the evangelistic campaign that established the Anchovy Seventh-day Adventist Church four decades ago. Reflecting on the church's journey, Dr. Robinson warned that Satan would seek to create division within the body of Christ and urged members to remain firmly anchored in their faith. "God wants you to build upon the Rock," he said.

"United we stand; divided we fall. The enemies of the church will seek to disrupt, disturb, destroy, divide, and harass the leadership, but as a flock we must learn to live together."

Calling the congregation to unity, he concluded: "As a flock, let us dwell together; as a body, let us unite; as a building, let us be framed together for the Kingdom. Let us strive together, for when we are together, victory is guaranteed."

The anniversary celebrations began the previous evening with a vespers service on Friday, July 31. One of the evening's highlights came when Elder N. Gillette, a former member now residing overseas, reflected on the church's early years.

She recounted the struggles, sacrifices, and dedication that led to the establishment of the Anchovy congregation, reminding members of the pioneers whose faith and perseverance laid the foundation for the ministry that continues today.

Host Pastor Jermane McBean also led a special dedication service during which a new lectern was presented to the church. Adding a significant layer of recognition to the proceedings was the presence of Pastor Vincent Rose, President of the West Jamaica Conference.

Pastor Rose delivered the keynote address, offering a profound theological reflection on the occasion.

"We are not celebrating because the church is good, but because we serve a good God," he declared, setting the tone for his message.

Drawing from Exodus 25 vs 8, he reminded the congregation of God's desire to dwell among His people, stating, "I want you to make me a place because I have a desire to dwell with you; and it is a honour to have God dwell with us."

He further challenged the church to look beyond the physical structure.

"The church is not here to look pretty and nice," he emphasized. It is here to regenerate itself, producing people for God to dwell among. God wants to dwell with us and can only do so if we want Him to," he ended.

During the service, Pastor Vincent Rose and his wife, Jody, were presented with tokens of appreciation in recognition of their leadership and support. The programme concluded with a prayer of dedication by Pastor Vencot Dyer, Executive Secretary of the West Jamaica Conference, who prayed for God's continued blessing on the congregation.

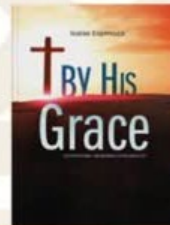
The anniversary celebrations honoured the church's rich history while reaffirming its commitment to proclaiming the gospel and serving the Anchovy community for generations to come.

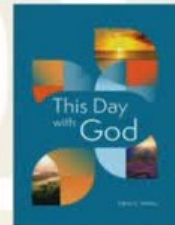

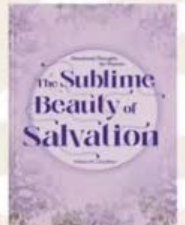

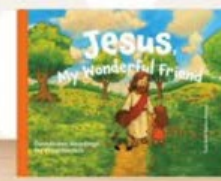

BLACKNESS, Westmoreland

Beyond their extensive work at Darliston Preparatory School, the mission team from the Palm Springs Seventh-day Adventist Church in Florida fulfilled a deeply personal promise to local resident Alecia Pennycooke Cheddán.

When members of the mission team first visited Blackness, Burnt Savannah, Westmoreland in March 2025, they witnessed the severe devastation left behind by Hurricane Melissa. Among those hit hardest were Mrs. Cheddán, her husband, and their four young children, who lost everything in the storm.

A two-bedroom, one-bathroom house was donated through the support of the West Jamaica Conference and volunteers from several churches across the territory to provide shelter for the family. However, when team members from Palm Springs visited and asked Mrs. Cheddán how they could assist her family in rebuilding their lives, her request was grounded entirely in self-reliance rather than a temporary handout: she asked for a chicken coop so she could sustain her household and start a small business.

Pastor Omar Palmer, district pastor of the Palm Springs Seventh-day Adventist Church, recalled the emotional encounter: "We remembered that very famous picture of her baby out there on a mattress underneath a coconut tree," Pastor Palmer shared.

"When we asked what she needed to help her family, she told us, 'I am not asking for things; I just want to be able to help my family.' She said a chicken coop would help, and we promised her right then that we were going to do that. When we returned to Palm Springs, we literally asked everyone in our congregation who had Jamaican dollars at home to bring them in, knowing that every bit would help purchase at least one chicken."

Determined to deliver on that commitment during their July 2026 return mission trip, the collaborative team—working alongside international non-profit Restore a Child—provided all necessary materials and fully constructed a sturdy 12x8-foot chicken coop.

Additionally, they gifted her 100 chicks along with 18 bags of feed—enough to nourish the flock for their entire six-week lifespan. The sustainable project empowers Mrs. Cheddán to feed her family, generate income, and reinvest in growing her poultry business in the months ahead.

Expressing her deep appreciation, Mrs. Cheddán shared her gratitude for the life-changing support:

"Words can never be enough to express how grateful I am," Mrs. Cheddán said. "Palm Springs SDA and Restore a Child provided my family with a ray of hope. I will never forget their kind gesture, and my family and I are truly appreciative."

Pathfinder Director, Nover Ferguson-Brown highlighted the practical, empowering nature of the project:

"Living out the proverb that it's better to teach a man to fish, we watched the mom fill with gratitude as her oldest son jumped right in to care for the flock," said Nover Ferguson-Brown. "Seeing this family empowered for the future warmed all of our hearts, and we are grateful that we could make a lasting difference."

Pastor Ziggario Richards, district pastor for the Coote Savannah District of Churches, also commended the mission team for their heart of service.

"I am truly grateful for the assistance given to the Cheddian family," Pastor Richards stated. "They have been through a lot, and it warms my heart to know that there are still people in the world who genuinely care for those in need."

Reflecting on the overall mission trip, Pastor Palmer emphasized that true ministry knows no geographical boundaries and encouraged others to lend a helping hand wherever a need exists:

"We hope the projects we completed will have a great impact and lasting benefit, and we look forward to what we can continue to do as a church," Pastor Palmer reflected.

"Believe it or not, I don't know anyone from Darliston personally. I'm not originally from the West Jamaica Conference; I'm from Central Jamaica. But it's not about where I'm from, it's about where the need is.

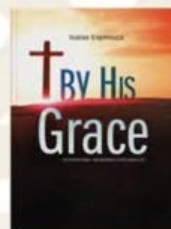
We went and did what we could, and as a church, we are committed to doing whatever else we can to help. We encourage others from everywhere to assist as much as they can. 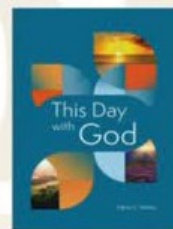

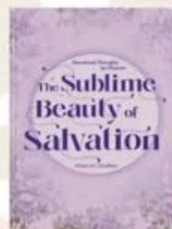

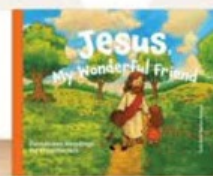

Adventist Church in Mexico Unveils Mobile Production Truck to Expand Gospel Reach

New Hope Media Chiapas unit will support live broadcasts, digital evangelism, and content for Indigenous communities across the state.

The Seventh-day Adventist Church in Chiapas, Mexico, recently unveiled a mobile television production truck that will enable Hope Media Chiapas to produce and transmit gospel programming from locations throughout the state.

The newly acquired unit was inaugurated on July 18 during the Chiapas Mexican Union's second Short Film Festival. About 220 young communicators, filmmakers, church leaders, and members of the union's Creative Disciples initiative attended the ceremony at the union headquarters in Tuxtla Gutiérrez.

Church leaders said the truck will support evangelistic campaigns, facilitate coverage of church events, strengthen local congregations, and distribute programming across digital platforms. It will also help develop content in the Indigenous languages spoken throughout Chiapas and carry messages of hope to people who cannot easily attend church programs in person.

"I want this mobile unit to travel throughout our territory for the glory of the Lord," said Pastor José Luis Bouchot, president of the Chiapas Mexican Union. He described the truck as the result of cooperation among the union's nine local fields and called for it to be used to develop innovative evangelistic and community-oriented projects.

While in Chiapas for a pastoral visit, Pastor Abner De los Santos, president of the Inter-American Division, emphasized the need to use communication technology with a clear spiritual purpose.

"We live in a time when communication has unprecedented reach," De los Santos said. "A message can reach thousands of people in seconds. Technology is not an end in itself, but an instrument God can use so that more people may know Jesus."

A Studio on Wheels

Félix Cortés, an engineer with Mexican broadcaster TV Azteca who assisted with the unit's installation, presented its production and transmission capabilities. The vehicle is equipped for television production, live broadcasting, streaming, and content distribution through multiple digital platforms. It also includes a cooling system, connections for external electricity, its own generator, and specialized production equipment.

"It is well equipped to meet the production needs in Chiapas," Cortés said. "We hope they will enjoy it and make the most of it."

The vehicle will give the union's local fields a shared production resource for responding to events and ministry opportunities throughout Chiapas, including communities located far from fixed production facilities.

Part of a Broader Digital Strategy

The production truck is part of a broader digital evangelism strategy in Chiapas connected with OneVoice27, a world church initiative seeking to unite communication efforts and mobilize members to proclaim the message of Jesus through different methods and platforms.

Approximately 250,000 people connected with previous digital campaigns in Chiapas through social media and other communication platforms. The church also developed the Esperanza Chiapas digital platform, introduced online Bible courses, and created an artificial intelligence assistant that allows users to study the Bible through WhatsApp.

The union now aims to establish an active social media presence in 80 percent of its congregations. It will also continue training Creative Disciples—a network of content creators, communicators, and other church members who use their artistic, digital, and professional talents for online evangelism and faith-based storytelling—across its nine local fields.

The training is designed to move participants beyond simply producing content toward developing an intentional pathway for evangelism and discipleship. Instruction in storytelling, directing, audience engagement, artificial intelligence tools, and culturally relevant communication prepare Creative Disciples to reach people who do not know Jesus and connect media content with Bible study and continued spiritual growth.

JAILBREAK: THERE IS POWER IN PRAYER

DID YOU KNOW?

In the ancient world, being guarded by four quaternions of soldiers—sixteen armed guards—meant an absolute, inescapable death sentence, yet a praying church completely neutralized Rome's top security system without lifting a single physical weapon.

This sermon, titled "Jailbreak: There is Power in Prayer" explores the miraculous deliverance of the Apostle Peter from King Herod's prison in Acts 12, serving as a powerful reminder that no earthly chain or impossible circumstance can withstand the earnest prayers of God's people. By contrasting the hostility of Herod with the unstoppable force of unrelenting prayer, the message emphasizes that God actively works on behalf of His children even in their darkest, midnight hours. Drawing upon biblical accounts like Moses at the Red Sea and King Hezekiah facing the Assyrian army, the sermon demonstrates that persistent faith turns overwhelming trials into sweet victories, assuring believers that their past or background does not dictate their future under God's grace.

At its core, the sermon extends the concept of "jailbreak" beyond physical prison walls to address the spiritual, emotional, and psychological strongholds that lock people in past mistakes and painful circumstances. Through personal testimony and vivid illustration, it highlights God as a prayer-answering Liberator who operates beyond human limitations and timing. Ultimately, the message points to the ultimate "jailbreak"—the resurrection of Jesus Christ over sin and death—inviting every listener to trade despair for praise, place their trust in the divine will of God, and rely on the power of the blood to break every chain.

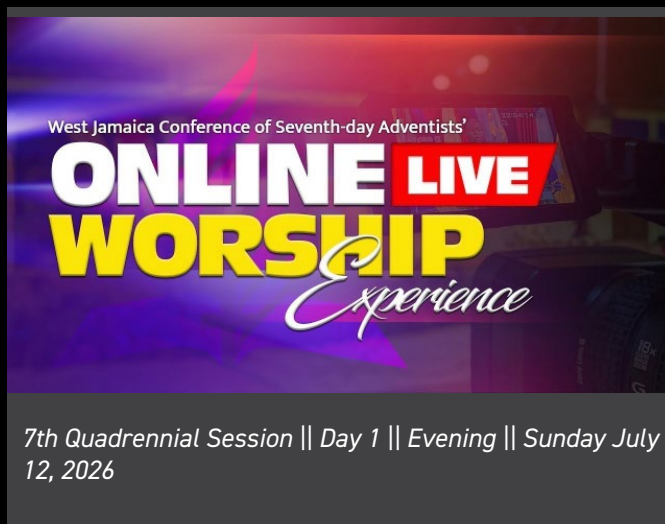
