PASTOR VINCENT ROSE ELECTED PRESIDENT OF WEST JAMAICA CONFERENCE



Pastor Vincent G Rose has been elected President of West Jamaica Conference at the 7th Quadrennial Session.

MONTEGO BAY, St. James

Delegates at the 7th Quadrennial Session of West Jamaica Conference elected Pastor Vincent G. Rose to serve as President on Sunday, July 12, 2026, at the Seventh-day Adventist Conference Centre in Montego Bay, St. James. After deliberations, the Nominating Committee returned their report at 10:15 p.m. Upon receiving the proposal, delegates used the new electronic voting system to cast their votes. Of the 279 delegates voting, 84.58% voted in favour of Pastor Vincent Rose.

He has faithfully served the Seventh-day Adventist Church for many years. Pastor Rose served as Youth Ministries Director from 2016-2019, Ministerial Secretary from 2019-2022 and Executive Secretary from 2022-2026. He was then appointed President by the conference's Executive Committee in March of this year following the election of then President, Pastor Glen O. Samuels as President of the Jamaica Union Conference during the Union's Third Quinquennial Session.

Accepting his newest responsibility of leading the Conference for the next quadrennium, he expressed humility, emphasizing that the call to leadership is ultimately an act of God's grace.

"I am convinced that no man truly deserves this work. We are only sent here by the grace of God."

He also commended the strength of the membership, leadership, and youth of West

Jamaica Conference.

"Having worked with our elders, I believe we have some of the best you can find anywhere. Having worked with our youth for the past eight years, I am convinced our young people are second to none. Our officers, leaders, and members are primed and ready to pursue the mission."

The President concluded by appealing for the continued prayers and support of the Conference as he begins his new assignment.

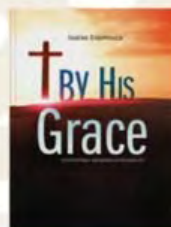

Pastor Rose is supported in ministry by his wife Jody Rose and his 3 children, Khyllie, Khaliece and Kharlyle.

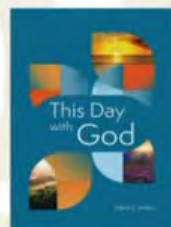

Adventist Global Creator Summit Brings Digital Storytellers Together for 'OneVoice27'

Opening day of the church's first-ever Creator Summit brought together more than 165 participants to help shape OneVoice27.

Nearly 200 Seventh-day Adventist content creators, influencers, designers, social media managers, and communication leaders from around the world gathered at General Conference headquarters on July 20 for the opening day of the church's first-ever Creator Summit, where they began shaping OneVoice27, a global digital initiative designed to unite Adventists in proclaiming Jesus across every digital platform.

General Conference President Erton Köhler said the decision to hold the summit at the church's world headquarters was intentional, despite the visa and travel challenges many participants faced. The location, he said, was meant to signal that digital creators are important partners in the church's mission and that their experience, ideas, and talents are needed.

"You are important for the Church. Your ministry is vital for our mission, and we are counting on you," Köhler told participants. He said God had entrusted them with unique gifts to help prepare people for Christ's return. Köhler emphasized that the summit was not designed primarily to teach participants how to

become better creators or influencers. Instead, they were invited to share their perspectives, offer recommendations, and help shape how OneVoice27 could be adapted across different cultures and digital spaces.

“Your voice matters,” he said. “What you have to say, the suggestions and recommendations are vital for us.”

As he transitioned into the vision behind OneVoice27, Köhler removed his tie, drawing smiles from the audience and signaling a shift from a formal welcome to a more conversational discussion, gaining a clearer picture of the earthquake’s impact on Adventist members and congregations across the affected territory.

A Global Movement

He described OneVoice27 not as a General Conference project to be handed down through the church’s organizational structure, but as a global movement that divisions, unions, local fields, congregations, members, and creators can adapt to their own realities.

“You are the owner of the project,” Köhler said, encouraging participants to preserve its central purpose while expressing it through their own languages, cultures, and creative styles.

The initiative seeks to unite Adventists around a shared message while empowering individuals and organizations to use their own voices and communication platforms to proclaim the hope of Jesus in the lead-up to a coordinated worldwide emphasis in September 2027.

“Our dream is to see Jesus coming soon, so let us do everything we can to prepare many people for that day,” he said

Köhler summarized the initiative through three guiding principles—Project, Preparation, and Purpose—describing OneVoice27 as a movement to proclaim Jesus, prepare the church spiritually, and mobilize members for mission.

Creativity Rooted in Mission

Alyssa Truman, communication director of the General Conference, reminded participants that creativity itself reflects the character of God.

“In the beginning, God created,” Truman said. “The way that God introduces himself to humanity...is as a creator. And then we are made in His image. That means you, as creatives, live out the very first way that we have come to know God.”

She encouraged attendees to recognize that their influence reaches audiences in ways traditional ministry often cannot, whether through faith-based content or other digital platforms.

LET GOD BE GOD - SERMON

Paul, in writing to the Corinthians—and in writing to the brethren here in the West Jamaica Conference—says in 1 Corinthians 1:10: “Now I beseech you, brethren, by the name of our Lord Jesus Christ, that ye all speak the same thing, and that there be no divisions among you; but that ye be perfectly joined together in the same mind and in the same judgment.”

Is Paul trying to muzzle the delegates at the session this morning? Is Paul trying to say that we must not have our own opinion? I don't hear Paul saying that! I hear Paul saying that we must allow the main thing to stay the main thing. There is only one thing God's church is here for, and that is to preach the everlasting Gospel. God established His church not for profiling, not to pat persons on the back, give them accolades, and hand out positions. God's church has been established to win the lost at any cost!

In His departing message, He says: “All power is

given unto Me in heaven and in earth. Go ye therefore, and teach all nations, baptizing them in the name of the Father, and of the Son, and of the Holy Ghost.” And He made us aware of the fact that we are not sent out alone, for He promises, “Lo, I am with you always, even unto the end of the world.”

God knows what He is doing. Throughout history, God has set up kingdoms, dethroned kings, and allowed His agenda alone to reign supreme. It doesn't matter what man's agenda is all about; it doesn't matter what all the plotting and scheming is about—in the end, God and God alone will reign supreme!

May I draw your attention to 1 Samuel 16:1: “And the Lord said unto Samuel, How long wilt thou mourn for Saul, seeing I have rejected him from reigning over Israel? fill thine horn with oil, and go, I will send thee to Jesse the Bethlehemite: for I have provided me a king among his sons.”

The servant of the Lord was nervous—just like some of you this morning!

“And Samuel said, How can I go? if Saul hear it, he will kill me. And the Lord said, Take an heifer with thee, and say, I am come to sacrifice to the Lord. And call Jesse to the sacrifice, and I will shew thee what thou shalt do: and thou shalt anoint unto me him whom I name unto thee.”

Church of the living God, don't allow man to tell you what to do. That is the way of the world. When politicians want your vote, they come around giving you box food and thousand-dollar bills. Don't let any man tell you what to do—let the Lord tell you what to do!

“And Samuel did that which the Lord spake, and came to Bethlehem. And the elders of the town trembled at his coming, and said, Comest thou peaceably? And he said, Peaceably: I am come to sacrifice unto the Lord: sanctify yourselves, and come with me to the sacrifice. And he sanctified Jesse and his sons, and called them to the sacrifice.”

I want us to understand that the business of selecting

leaders for God's church is a highly religious exercise. It must not be entered into willy-nilly. Fervently, we must pray and ask God for His direction, because as our Union President would say, "The church will not rise higher than the spirituality of its leaders."

God needs spiritual leaders to lead His church at such a time as this! God needs, as Sister White says: "Men who are as true to duty as the needle to the pole; men who in their innermost soul have a connection with God; men who will not be bought or sold; men who will not vacillate; men who will not play 'in the river and on the bank,' but men who will stand up for truth; men who will stand up and say, 'Thus saith the Lord!'"

The Bible says in verse 6: "And it came to pass, when they were come, that he looked on Eliab, and said, Surely the Lord's anointed is before him. But the Lord said unto Samuel, Look not on his countenance, or on the height of his stature; because I have refused him: for the Lord seeth not as man seeth; for man looketh on the outward appearance, but the Lord looketh on the heart."

What you and I can't see, what you and I don't know, God knows! That is why you and I need to ask for divine wisdom so that we can make the right selections. Jesse allowed his sons to pass before Samuel. One by one they came, like a Miss World pageant, walking down as Samuel looked at them. In his human mind, Samuel would have anointed one of them, but the Lord said, "NO!" When they had all passed, Samuel asked, "Are here all thy children?" Because they had all gone by, and the Lord had not given His approval. Look at Jesse's response: "There remaineth yet the youngest, and, behold, he keepeth the sheep. And Samuel said unto Jesse, Send and fetch him: for we will not sit down till he come hither."

God is in charge of His church, and what we need to do is stand still and see the salvation of the Lord! Don't allow selfish thoughts and ideas, or the cunning speech and canvassing of men or women, to cause us to miss what God has in mind for His church.

"And he sent, and brought him in. Now he was ruddy, and withal of a beautiful countenance, and goodly to look to. And the Lord said, Arise, anoint him: for this is he."

God's choice is the best choice! In our human wisdom, we make mistakes. When we depend on self, we err. Today, the church of the living God needs to say, "Wash me thoroughly, dear Lord, with eyesalve so that I may see. Help me, Lord, to surrender my will so that I may say, Not my will, but Thine be done!" Praise Jesus!

God's church needs to allow God to be God. I don't know why they asked me to speak this morning, because I didn't think I was the right person. For years, I refused the prompting of men to become a minister of the Gospel—you know why? I don't like the politics in

the church! I don't think that is what God wants for His church. When God's people are ready to humble themselves in the sight of the Lord and allow God to lead His church, much of the problems we have in the church today will be gone long-time!

Why do you think the Israelites took 40 years instead of 40 days to go through the wilderness? Because they murmured and rebelled against God, wanting to have their own way. And as Adventists, we sing, "I want to go to heaven and rest, I'm tired of staying down here." But we aren't tired! If we were tired, we would stop doing the things that are keeping us here and start allowing God to be God so that this Gospel can be preached in all the world, the work can be finished, and Jesus can come!

I pray that over these two days, the delegates of my conference of birth—the West Jamaica Conference—will allow God to have His way. I want every delegate to say: "Have Thine own way, Lord! Have Thine own way! Thou art the Potter, I am the clay. Mold me and make me after Thy will, while I am waiting, yielded and still."

Are you yielded to Almighty God? Because if we aren't, we are going to continue going around in circles in the wilderness—just marking time and suffering until everyone dies out. I want us to allow God to be God. As you caucus together in your groups, and as you meet with the nominating committee, ask God to speak to your heart—and listen as He speaks. What a beautiful thing it will be at the end of this session when the Lord says, "This is the man. This is the one of my choosing." Then, this church militant will become the church triumphant! Victoriously, the church will rise to meet our God in the skies!
