MONTEGO BAY, ST.JAMES — The West Jamaica Conference of Seventh-day Adventists inaugurated its newly elected leaders on Sabbath, August 29, 2026, at the Seventh-day Adventist Conference Centre in Mount Salem, Montego Bay, following the election of Conference officers and departmental directors during its Seventh Quadrennial Session in July of this year.

Addressing the congregation following his inauguration, Conference President Pastor Vincent G. Rose described his new role as an opportunity to serve and called on the Church to remain focused on

mission, with prayer and personal devotion at its foundation.

"This is not an accomplishment but an opportunity for service. When men forsake you, it is good to know you are still in the hands of God. It's not about me but about what God has done, what He is doing and what He will continue to do," Rose said.

Calling mission the Church's number one priority, Rose challenged leaders to ensure that prayer remains central to church life.

"Rebuilding the church requires personal devotion. It is the key to retention and consolidation. Christ's

prayer is that we will bear much fruit and the fruit will remain. I want us to hand over a church where prayer is still paramount. A praying church is a strong church. The evidence shows that the mission has always thrived in adversity. It's no time for the church to become distracted. I challenge my leaders and members, let's work together."

Pastor Glen O. Samuels, President of the Jamaica Union Conference, delivered the message and led portions of the Service of Consecration. He was joined by Jamaica Union Conference Executive Secretary Pastor Karl A. Archer and Treasurer Pastor Adlai Blythe in presenting the responsibilities of the Conference's principal officers: Pastor Vincent G. Rose, President; Pastor Vencot Dyer, Executive Secretary; and Mrs. Marion Barrett-Popkin, Treasurer. The service also included charges to the departmental directors and Executive Committee members.

In his message to the new leaders, Samuels cautioned against confusing popularity with Christian influence and stressed the responsibility of leaders to model the life of Christ.

"Ours is a nation that is more adept at having great followership than following the Lord Jesus Christ. Algorithms can give you a prestigious place in the social media arena. But in order to find a place in the kingdom of God you and I need to be genuine followers of the Lord Jesus Christ."

Samuels said Christian leadership also requires hard work and a willingness to continue loving those being led when the task becomes difficult.

"Part of Christian leadership is to set an example of hard work so that others who look on do not find sanctuary in inactivity. Leadership must love people even when they test the mettle of your leadership, for we have been called to model the life of Jesus Christ and that is not an easy task."

The service was attended by Custos Rotulorum of St. James, Bishop the Honourable Conrad Pitkin; Mayor of Montego Bay, Councillor Richard Vernon; and Assistant Commissioner of Police Glenford Miller, commanding officer for Area One.

In his remarks, Bishop Pitkin called on the new leadership to work together and extend the influence of the Church beyond its congregations.

"May the officers, directors and Executive Committee members work together in harmony, guided by the Holy Spirit and united in purpose," Pitkin said. "May your leadership strengthen the church, inspire the membership, and make a meaningful difference in the wider community."

CAVE SDA CHURCH RESTORES HOME FOR DISABLED CHURCH MEMBERS

CAVE, WESTMORELAND — What began as an urgent plea for help has culminated in a story of compassion and renewal. On August 5, 2026, the Seventh-day Adventist Church, Cave in Westmoreland officially handed over a fully renovated home to two church members facing severe physical and living challenges.

The project targeted the dire living conditions of 72-year-old Brother Kennel George Cornwall, who has been an amputee since 2004, and his 37-year-old cousin, Devellie Lonely, who lives with visual impairment and retains only about 15 percent of his sight. Prior to the intervention, the men lived beneath a small, dilapidated wooden structure filled with debris, lacking a proper kitchen, furniture, or indoor bathroom.

Recognizing the urgency of the situation, Elder Damion Williams, who serves as the Personal Ministries and Men's Ministries Leader at the church, was instrumental in sounding the alarm for assistance.

"They were in a very poor situation that I believe no human should be living in," shared Elder Williams during the initial appeal for intervention. "Brother Cornwall is mentally and spiritually strong, but he is not able to move on his own. They are grateful for any help they can get to take them out of this situation."

Mobilizing the Community Services Department, deacons, deaconesses, and local church members cleared the site of accumulated scrap metal and waste before launching a complete structural overhaul. Volunteers poured concrete around the foundation to reinforce the wooden support pillars, laid a solid concrete floor, built a fully functioning indoor bathroom, and outfitted the residence with brand-new beds and essential household items.

"The house was totally devastated—basically like a garbage bin with old iron and structural decay," noted Elder Williams following the completion of the project. "We simply wanted to see our brethren live with dignity."

The project was realized through key partnerships, with liaison support provided by Pastor Levi Johnson, former Jamaica Union Executive Secretary. Pastor Johnson connected local leaders with retired Pastor Michael Bernard and his wife, Sister Bernard, from Altamonte Springs, Florida, who generously provided total funding for the renovation project.

Pastor Donald Hill, Pastor for the Whitehouse District of Churches, emphasized the impact of the initiative:

“Our community has felt the love of the church through actual deeds, not just words. Alongside our Hurricane Melissa relief efforts impacting the district—delivering thousands of care packages and building several houses with help from all the conferences within the Jamaica Union Conference and private donors who provided housing materials—this project represents a bright, lasting start. Unlike temporary food aid or basic repairs, this home was fully restored specifically for our brothers. We are immensely grateful to Pastor and Sister Bernard, Pastor and Sister Johnson, Elder Williams, and the Seventh-day Adventist Church, Cave family.”

Enditnow Mobilizes Thousands Across Inter-America to Stand Against Violence

Adventists take to streets and communities with marches, prayer, education and acts of compassion.

Thousands of Seventh-day Adventists took their message against abuse and violence beyond church walls on Aug. 22, filling streets, parks and public spaces across the Inter-American Division (IAD) with marches, community programs, prayer and acts of service as part of the global Enditnow emphasis Sabbath.

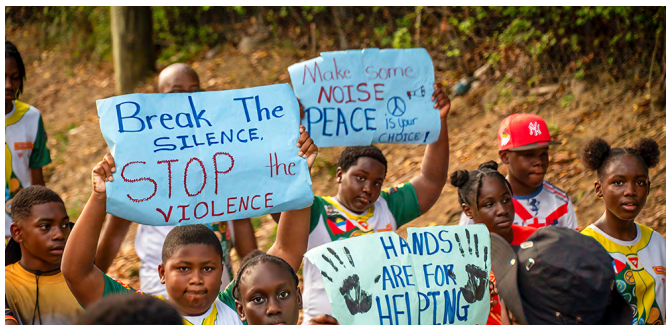
From The Bahamas and the Caribbean to Mexico, Central America, Colombia and Venezuela, church members carried banners calling for an end to violence, distributed literature, held educational programs and reached vulnerable people with food and other practical assistance.

The activities centered on this year's theme, "Moved with Compassion," which challenged members not only to recognize abuse but to respond to suffering with the compassion demonstrated by Jesus. The special Sabbath was part of a broader 31-day IAD campaign throughout August featuring daily digital reflections, practical challenges and shareable resources designed to make compas-

sion an everyday response to abuse and violence. For Sandra Pinto, women's ministries and children and adolescent ministries director for the IAD, seeing that message move into communities across the territory was significant.

"It was deeply moving to see the mobilization throughout Inter-America," Pinto said. "It wasn't just marches with signs; we saw compassion in its purest form."

Young people, women and entire families prayed for people in need, provided food to vulnerable families and offered encouragement and guidance to those experiencing hardship, she said.

"It was faith moving beyond the four walls of the church to embrace the pain of the community," Pinto said.

A Public Stand in The Bahamas

In Nassau, members of the South Bahamas Conference marched along East Street before gathering at Rawson Square for a rally that was broadcast on national radio. Church leaders, advocates and community representatives addressed domestic violence, child abuse and gender-based violence.

Ann Marie Davis, wife of the prime minister of The Bahamas, told participants that compassion must

lead to action.

"Compassion is not only about caring," Davis said. "It is about allowing that care to move us into action." She called on communities to refuse silence, support those healing from abuse and work toward environments where people feel safe and valued.

Senate President J. LaShell Adderley challenged churches to recognize their responsibility toward people experiencing abuse, while Marissa Mason-Smith, chair of the Protection Against Violence Commission, urged participants to continue speaking and acting after the rally ended.

"This evening we march with compassion, but tomorrow we must act with courage," Mason-Smith said, emphasizing that sustained action can turn a single voice into a movement committed to protecting people and restoring dignity.

REBUILDING THE FOUNDATIONS: A CALL TO SPIRITUAL LEADERSHIP

DID YOU KNOW?

Did you know that during a time of national crisis, U.S. President Abraham Lincoln openly admitted he was repeatedly driven to his knees because he realized he had nowhere else to go?

In this powerful installation sermon, Pastor Glen Samuels, President of the Jamaica Union Conference, challenged newly installed leadership—specifically Pastor Vincent G. Rose, President of the West Jamaica Conference and his team—to recognize that solid church and nation-building cannot rely on human wisdom, financial reserves, or institutional tradition. Drawing a sharp contrast between mere outward religiosity and true spirituality, the message juxtaposes the troubling question of Psalm 11:3 (“If the foundations be destroyed, what can the righteous do?”) with the prophetic mandate of Isaiah 58:12 to rebuild ancient ruins and restore fallen foundations. Grounded in the conviction that Jamaica’s national identity is uniquely anchored in prayer, the sermon emphasizes that true transformation begins when leaders ground themselves entirely in the unshakeable presence and authority of God rather than popular opinion or administrative titles.

The core focus of the address centers on the practical reality of Christian leadership under pressure. Reminding the congregation that even legendary leaders like Moses faced severe tests from the very people they led, the speaker underscores that authentic leadership requires unwavering love, personal integrity, and a deep life of prayer. Rather than relying on past accomplishments, modern algorithms, or superficial appearances, leaders are urged to seek daily divine direction on their knees, return to the foundational truths of Scripture, and lead the church toward a fresh anointing of the Holy Spirit. Ultimately, the sermon delivers an inspiring call of hope: despite economic uncertainty, social decay, or institutional trials, the greatest days for both the church and the nation lie ahead for those who faithfully build upon God’s enduring power.

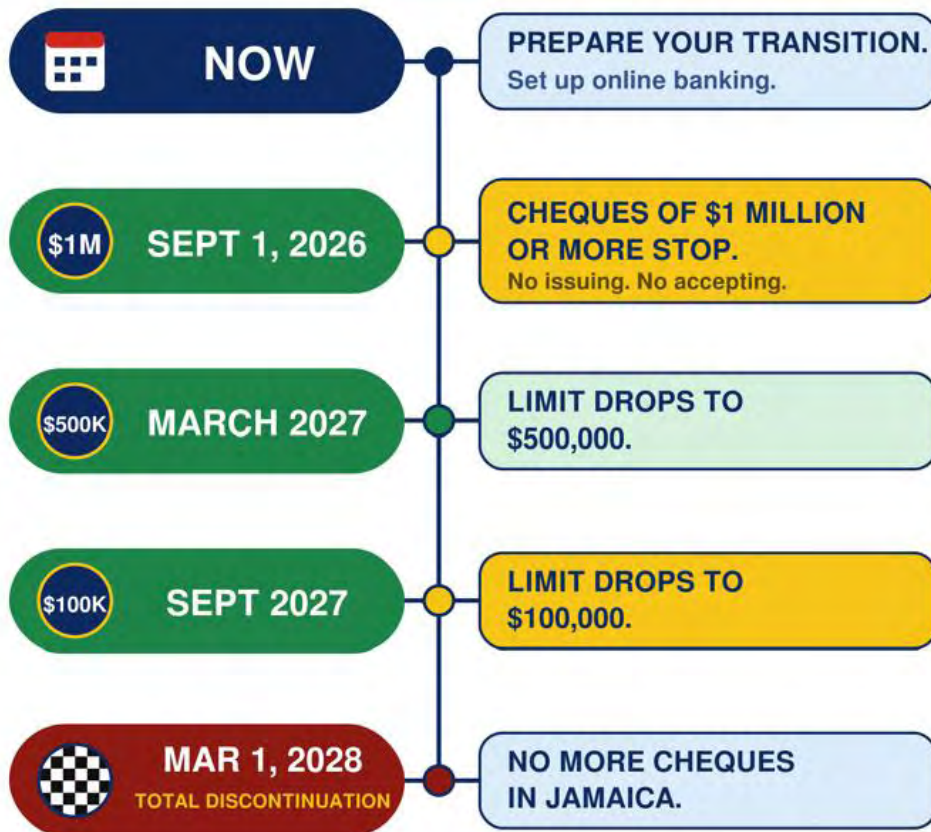
