SDA CHURCH FAMILY CELEBRATES CENTENARIAN ANDREW CAMPBELL

Glowing tributes and congratulatory messages flowed at the Mt Salem Seventh-day Adventist (SDA) Church in St James on Tuesday, as relatives and church members gathered for a luncheon honouring 100-year-old Andrew Campbell of Lilliput, also in St James.

Despite being visually impaired and requiring a wheelchair for mobility, Campbell, a retired builder and former elder of the Mt Salem SDA congregation, briefly expressed gratitude for the luncheon marking his centenary. The occasion was highlighted by tribute messages from Governor General Sir Patrick Allen, Labour Minister Parnell Charles Jr, and Pastor Vincent Rose, president of the West Jamaica Conference of Seventh-day Adventists.

"I am thankful to everyone, to the Mt Salem brethren and to everyone else, so much so that I cannot explain myself. I give thanks in the name of Jesus, and I thank you all for coming," a tearful Campbell told the gathering.

"There is nowhere like home, home sweet home. I'm pressing on the upward way, new heights I'm gaining every day, still praying as I onward bound. Lord, plant my feet on higher ground," he added, referencing a verse from the church hymn Higher Ground.

In his message to Campbell, which was read aloud at the function, Allen said reaching 100 years of age was a monumental achievement that should be

celebrated by loved ones.

"You will count among the small and distinguished group of persons to enjoy the blessing of attaining your 100th birthday. Celebrating a centenary is indeed a very special occasion, and I trust that you will be surrounded by loved ones who will help to make it a truly wonderful time for you as you embrace life and the many blessings you have enjoyed along the way," said the governor general.

Born in Maldon, St James, on August 11, 1926, Campbell was the fourth of nine children for to Joseph and Eletia Campbell. The new centenarian spent much of his childhood with his grandmother in the Vaughnsfield district of St James after his mother relocated to Kingston following his father's death.

In 1953, at age 27, Campbell, who attended Maldon Primary School, moved to Montego Bay and worked for several years as a carpenter. During that time, he helped build houses for the Government of Jamaica along Francis Isabella Road in Mt Salem and in the Cornwall Gardens community.

He was a founding member of the Mt Salem SDA Church when it was established in 1968. A year later, he married Mabel Blake, now deceased, and together they raised nine children, including three from previous relationships. The family would

later grow to include 10 grandchildren and 21 great-grandchildren.

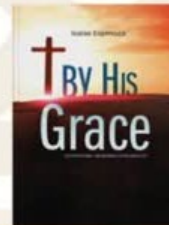
During Tuesday's celebration, son Roger Campbell recounted how his father was strict but devoted to raising his children in the fear of the Lord.

"Thanks be to God for my father, who brought us up in the church. He was very principled, and we could not make any mistakes in church, and I am still trying to live that way as an adult. Papa, thank you for all you have done for us all these years," said the younger Campbell.

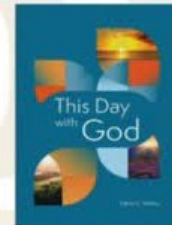

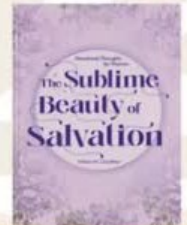

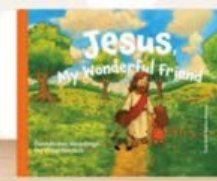

242 CAMPERS MARK HISTORIC RETURN TO CAMP BRAHAM FOR WESCONYOUCA 2026

TREASURE BEACH, ST. ELIZABETH — Strong youth participation took center stage as 242 campers filled the grounds of Camp Braham for WESCONYOUCA 2026, signaling a vibrant, high-energy return for the annual youth gathering after a two-year hiatus from the camp grounds.

Held under the theme “Rooted in Christ: Mobilized for Mission,” the camp mobilized two distinct groups across its two-week duration: 122 juniors gathered from July 21 to 28, followed immediately by 120 senior youth from July 28 to August 4.

The overwhelming turnout filled the newly restored facilities to capacity, driving dynamic participation across daily programming, community outreach initiatives, and spiritual services.

Youth Participation Drives Camp Success

“From the lips of the campers, it was one of the best camping experiences—the camp spirit was high, the chemistry was there, and we just give God praise and thanks for a successful return,” said Pastor Allan Green, Youth Ministries Director for the West Jamaica Conference.

To accommodate the influx of participants, camp leadership shifted toward a collaborative, youth-centered atmosphere that prioritized affirmation over strict enforcement.

“At camp, we generally look for those who are giving trouble or being mischievous, but as camp officers, we spoke to the campers with respect and affirmed them,” Pastor Green explained. “I believe that resonated well with the youth, and the feedback was overwhelmingly positive.”

That supportive culture culminated during the senior camp’s divine service, where a young male camper made the decision to be baptized. Demonstrating strong solidarity, fellow male campers surrounded him at the altar before walking alongside him down to the sea for his baptism.

The presence of the 242 young people extended into the surrounding Lewis Town and Treasure Beach communities through structured outreach projects. “It’s been a long time since we felt this kind of impact,” noted one local resident.

Restoring the Space for the Turnout

Hosting hundreds of attendees required an extensive physical recovery process. Prior to the event, Camp Braham suffered from severe disrepair, marked by overgrown thorny brush, wasp infestations, and dilapidated structures.

Under a recovery plan proposed by Area Coordinator Bryan Palmer (“Tall P”), groundsman and youth volunteers from various parish federations conducted bi-weekly work sessions over four months. Together, they cleared the grounds and restored three main cabins. A fourth cabin was completely renovated—including fresh paint and upgraded infrastructure—by the international missionary group Building for Eternity.

“Looking back, Camp Braham was not the ideal space for a youth camp, but we had a vision and determination,” Pastor Green added.

Supported by a veteran camper Deputy Director Murdelyn Donaldson and a unified staff, the leadership team successfully managed the large crowd throughout both sessions.

With attendance exceeding expectations, the Youth Department is preparing to expand cabin capacity and tent grounds ahead of the upcoming Youth Rally on December 13, 2026 to accommodate further growth.

Inter-American Division Becomes First to Hold Secretariat Academy Training

Union executive secretaries gain practical tools in governance, membership care, policy, and administration during the four-day training.

Strengthening the work of Secretariat as a vital part of church mission was at the center of a four-day Academy that brought executive secretaries from across the Inter-American Division (IAD) to its headquarters in Miami, Florida, Aug. 2–5, 2026.

Through presentations, workshops, and small-group discussions, union executive secretaries addressed governance, policy, membership management, records, strategic planning, parliamentary procedures, and other responsibilities, while sharing practical approaches they can apply across their territories.

Pastor Gerson Santos, associate secretary of the General Conference (GC), said Inter-America is the first world division to begin training under the newly launched GC Secretariat Academy. "This is a historic event," Santos said, explaining that the global program had been launched only days earlier. "Inter-America is beginning the first training of the Academy."

Building Competence for Mission

Pastor Selom Sessou, associate secretary of the GC and coordinator of the GC Secretariat Academy, said the initiative responds to the need for specialized preparation among executive secretaries, many of whom enter the position after years in pastoral or evangelistic ministry.

"We realized that there is a gap," Sessou said. The Academy is designed to build the "knowledge and competency to perform the task with confidence and accuracy," while strengthening efficiency, organization, time management, and problem-solving.

During the four-day Academy, participants received training on the role of the executive secretary, working policy, parliamentary procedures, strategic planning, calls and their processes, union reporting, Secretariat evaluation, statistical data interpretation, records management, church planting, Adventist Volunteer Service, VividFaith, and software and resources for Secretariat work at the local-field and local-church levels.

The Academy's broader foundational curriculum includes seven modules and 34 lessons covering the spiritual foundations of Secretariat, governance and committee management, policy and constitutional integrity, membership management and disciple-making, records and archives, and the mission of Secretariat.

Sessou said the Academy is intended to provide an ongoing learning environment where leaders can continue developing the competencies needed as administrative and ministry demands evolve.

'An Agent of Mission'

The spiritual responsibility of Secretariat leadership was also emphasized throughout the gathering.

During a devotional message, Santos reminded participants that church leaders must remain committed to continual growth. "The leadership of God's church is not a destination; it is a journey of continuous growth," he said, emphasizing that preserving the church's unity, integrity, and mission requires both professional development and a life grounded in Christ.

Pastor Pierre Caporal, executive secretary of the IAD, reinforced that perspective in his Aug. 5 devotional, "More Than a Scribe."

Drawing from the biblical relationship between Jeremiah and Baruch, Caporal described how Baruch's professional skills became instrumental in preserving and communicating the message God had entrusted to Jeremiah. He challenged executive secretaries to see a similar connection between their responsibilities and their calling.

"One can see in you a simple scribe, or a simple executive secretary, but God sees in you an agent of mission," Caporal said.

"Let us consecrate all our skills, our professionalism, our influence to God's mission," he added.

EQUIPPED TO SERVE, EMPOWERED TO SERVE, BUILDING ETERNITY TOGETHER

DID YOU KNOW?

Did you know that a church can be packed to capacity every single week, yet remain completely empty when it comes to active ministry? In a powerful address during the Friday evening vespers program of the Lay Workers' and Child Preachers' Training Institute, centered on the theme "Equipped to Serve, Empowered to Serve, Building Eternity Together," Pastor Joseph Smith urged believers to move off the sidelines and recognize that God has called every single member—not just a few professionals—to active service. Grounding his message in Ephesians 4:11–13 and 1 Peter 2:9, Pastor Smith highlighted that God's design for the church is to function as a dynamic training agency rather than a passive gathering place.

Drawing a sharp distinction between human capacity and divine impact, Pastor Smith emphasized that while organizational leaders equip the church with tools and preparation, only the Holy Spirit can empower members for truly effective, life-changing ministry. Citing scriptural examples from Moses to the early apostles, he reminded the congregation that God never waits for people to be perfect before calling them; instead, He calls ordinary individuals and develops them through His Spirit. Ultimately, the sermon called for total unity and collaboration across all generations and ministries, reminding believers that whether through digital outreach, community service, or personal intercession, every act of faith is an eternal investment in saving souls.

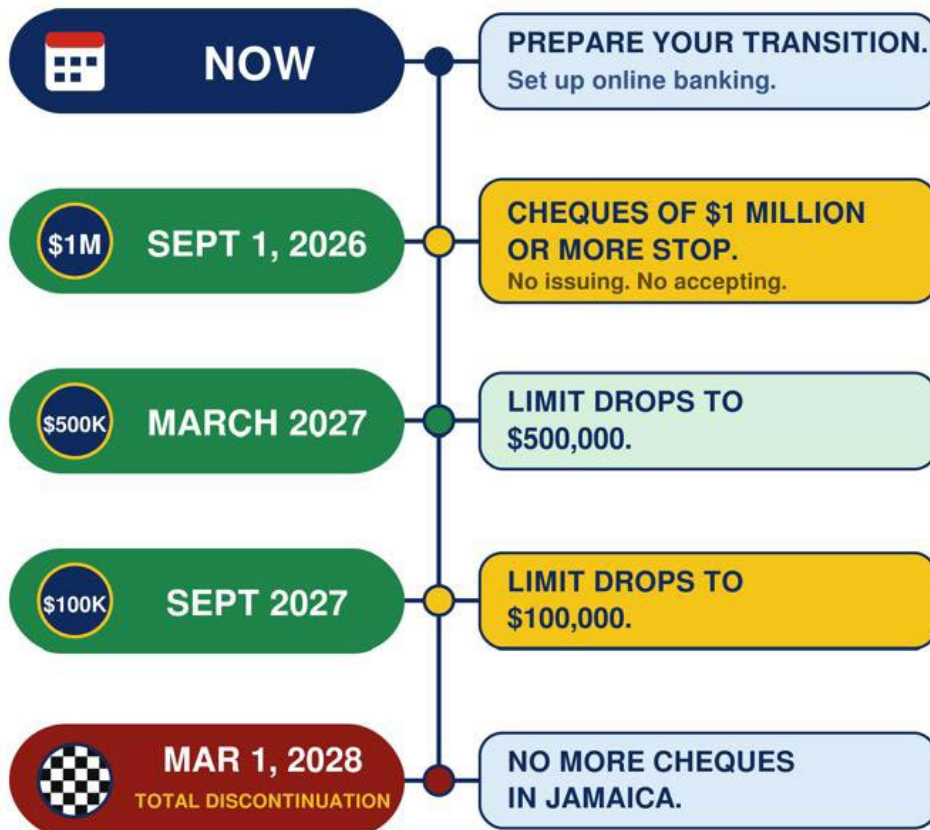

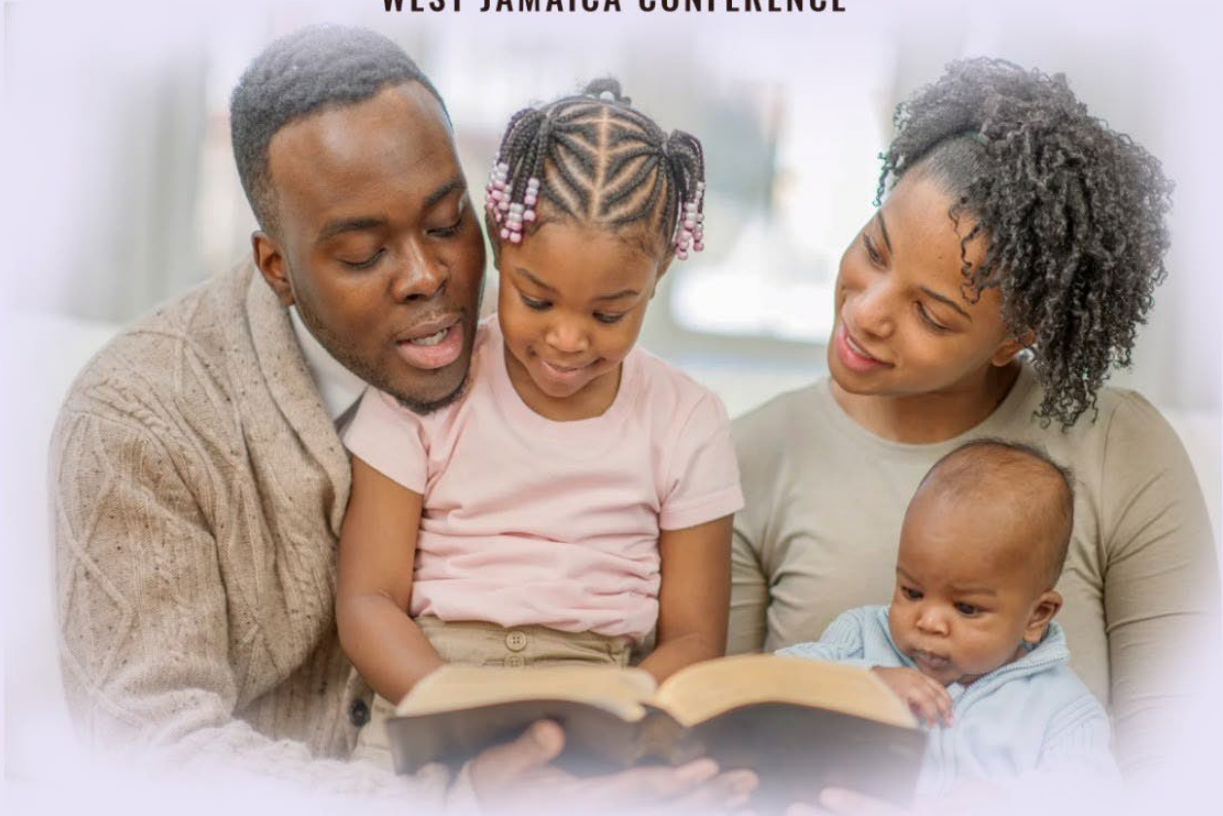
