103 YEARS OF FAITH, FAMILY, AND FATHERHOOD

WELCOME HALL, ST. JAMES — On June 15, 2026, Joel South Watson achieved a monumental milestone, celebrating his 103rd birthday. Born and raised in Somerton, St. James, in 1923, Watson's roots eventually pulled him to Tangle River, a place he frequented as a boy to visit his father. Upon reaching adulthood, he permanently relocated to the community, taking over his father's property, cultivation, and livestock—the very land he still resides on today.

In 1968, Watson married his late wife, Evelyn Adella Watson. At the time, she and her young daughter, Icyline, were already baptized Seventh-day Adventists, having accepted the Advent message while living in Palmyra, Rose Hall. Through their gentle encouragement and godly example after moving to Tangle River, Watson also embraced the faith. He became a baptized member and a cornerstone of the Tangle River Seventh-day Adventist Church within the Welcome Hall District. For his only daughter, now Mrs. Icyline Watson Young, Watson was a protector and a dedicated father whose support left an indelible mark on her childhood.

"When I was 12 years old, I attended Mount Alvernia High School," Mrs. Young recalled warmly. "We had a persistent issue with the morning bus. School began at 7:30 a.m., but the bus wouldn't arrive in Montego Bay until 8:00 a.m. Consequently, whenever I was late, I had to stand in the corridor for an hour before being admitted to class."

Distressed by the situation, young Icyline confided in her father. "One morning, he went down to the school himself to speak with the principal, Sister Elowin Marie. After that conversation, everything changed. Not only was I admitted to class immediately upon arrival, but I also received extra grace from the principal. That remains one of my most memorable moments with him; he was always there to help me through my education."

That same fierce dedication extended to Watson's service in the house of God, where he served as an active, faithful deacon until physical weakness limited his mobility.

Mrs. Young looks back affectionately on her parents' shared commitment to the church's community workdays. "My mother was a deaconess, so whenever we had church work on Sundays, my father would head down to the ground early to dig up some "food" (ground provisions). He'd pack it into a bag or basket, and they would head down to the church to cook for the workers."

Mrs. Young shared, "Pastor Thompson was the district pastor in those days, and he never missed a church work Sunday. He always carried his water boots in his car trunk, ready to step into whatever needed to be done. I remember one Sunday morning, Pastor said, "I can't stay

long, I have a wedding to conduct." My mother quickly chimed in, "No, Pastor, you haven't gotten your breakfast yet. The dumplings are frying, and the callaloo is steaming!" My father immediately backed her up, saying, "You can't leave! I have a piece of yam in a bag over there we haven't taken out for you yet." He was always so jovial and eager to help."

Though Icyline is his only biological child, Watson's home and heart have always been expansive; he is a beloved father figure to a host of nieces and nephews who call him their own.

Today, the family marvels at his longevity. He has outlived his siblings, who also enjoyed long lives—a brother who lived to 99, another to 87, and a sister to 98. Taking care of a centenarian comes with its unique blessings and lighthearted challenges.

"Everyone comes by to look at him and always gives me praise, saying, "Lin, you take such good care of Papa. Papa is always blooming and looking up," Ms. Young smiled.

"Sometimes he can be a bit stubborn, but I've grown to understand him completely now. I don't let the little things worry me. If I tell him something and he resists, I just gently say, "This is the way I want it, Papa." He might make up his face for a moment, but then he'll smile and say, "Alright, you young people know best, let me do as you say."

As Father's Day and his 103rd birthday converge, the family stands united in gratitude for a lifedefined by hard work, laughter, and Christian stewardship. For Joel South Watson, a century of living boils down to the simple, enduring legacy he passed on to his household: only what is done for Christ will ultimately matter.

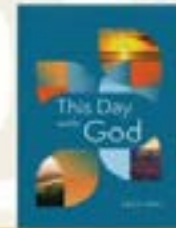

WEST JAMAICA CONFERENCE ESTABLISHES LAY WORKERS' PARISH FEDERATIONS



Members of the St. Elizabeth Lay Preacher and Bible Workers Federation

MONTEGO BAY, Jamaica — In a strategic move to strengthen local evangelism and support its front-line volunteers, the Personal Ministries Department of the West Jamaica Conference has officially established dedicated Parish Federations across the parishes within its constituency.

The historic initiative was the highlight of this year's annual Lay Preachers and Bible Workers' Federation Rallies, which drew over 800 lay workers under the theme, "Grounded in the Bible, Focused on the Mission, Restoring Hope."

To signify their formal installation, newly appointed Parish Executive Officers and district representatives were pinned during a special consecration ceremony, marking a new era of organized lay ministry for the conference.

A Vision for Mobilization and Care

Pastor Devon Heath, Personal Ministries Director of the West Jamaica Conference, explained that the new structure serves a dual purpose: maximizing soul-winning impact and creating a robust support system for the laity.

"The primary objectives of the Lay Workers Federation across the parishes are to train, mobilize, and recruit the lay workforce across the conference so that they can be actively involved in soul-winning at the local level," Pastor Heath stated.

Beyond evangelism, Heath emphasized that the Parish Federations are designed to operate as a close-knit family unit. Addressing a current shortage of lay preachers and Bible workers, the department is creating a central directory to streamline deployment. Crucially, the Federation will also oversee the welfare of its members. "If Bible workers fall on hard times, we want a Federation that can give monetary assistance or physical labor," Heath noted. "Therefore, the Parish Federation is basically bringing lay preachers into a family unit."

Leadership Reacts to the New Appointments

The rallies, which spanned Hanover, St. Elizabeth, St. James, and Westmoreland, saw local leaders ready to take on the challenge. Elder Ricky Thompson, from the Beeston Spring Seventh-day Adventist Church, was appointed President of the newly formed Westmoreland Federation.

"I am truly humbled and grateful for the confidence placed in me," Thompson said. "I see this not as a position, but as an opportunity to serve God and work alongside our lay preachers and Bible workers. My desire is to strengthen our team through spiritual growth, training, unity, and active mission."

"Let the Church Be the Church"

Pastor Jermaine Johnson, President of the North Jamaica Conference, served as the Divine Hour speaker for both the St. James and

Westmoreland rallies. In a powerful sermon entitled "Let the Church Be the Church," he challenged the newly minted federations to look inward and prioritize personal sanctification.

"The success of the mission is not based on mechanics; it is based on our heart condition with Jesus Christ," Pastor Johnson observed, adding that "the baptism of the Holy Spirit under fire is crucial to the success of the mission."

Acknowledging the grueling nature of soul-winning, Johnson offered a resounding word of encouragement to the workers facing difficult journeys: "Sometimes ministry gets difficult, sometimes it becomes discouraging, sometimes the labour feels unnoticed, and sometimes the progress is slow. But Jesus is saying the gates of hell shall not prevail against it. Your labour is not in vain, your witnessing is not pointless, your prayers are not wasted, your ministry is not forgotten, and your money is not useless. The church still has the power because Jesus Christ is alive and well."

Rallies Exceed Objectives

Reflecting on the multi-parish rollout, Pastor Heath concluded that the regional rallies fully achieved their targets, bringing unexpected blessings along with them. "We have the executive bodies in place; they have had their consecration services, they have been installed, and they are meeting to put the plans and the objectives of the Federation in place," Heath stated. "We are especially happy that, although it was not planned, we saw at least seven people being baptized through the rallies that we had."

Blind Theology Graduate Overcomes Barriers to Answer God's Call

Colombian Adventist completes theology degree after seven years of academic, financial, and accessibility challenges

When Félix Villalba received his Bachelor of Theology degree from Montemorelos University on May 17, it marked the culmination of a seven-year journey shaped by financial hardship, accessibility barriers, and what he and those around him describe as God's providential leading.

Born prematurely in Bucaramanga, Colombia, Villalba lost his sight due to retinal detachment in both eyes. From an early age, he faced challenges common to many people with visual disabilities, but he remained convinced that God was calling him to ministry.

His spiritual journey took a decisive turn in 2012 when he and his mother, María Delgado, were baptized at the La Joya Seventh-day Adventist Church in Bucaramanga. Three years later, while attending a camp for people with visual disabilities, he sensed a call to pastoral ministry.

Although he initially dreamed of studying music, Villalba said he gradually realized God was leading him in a different direction.

A Door Opens

After graduating from high school in 2016, Villalba sought opportunities to study theology in Colombia. Financial limitations, however, appeared to place that goal out of reach.

A turning point came when he met Edgar Redondo, then president of the North Colombian Union. After learning of Villalba's desire to prepare for ministry, Redondo encouraged him to contact Montemorelos University (UM), which offered a virtual theology program.

"After speaking with Félix and seeing not only his unique circumstances but also his desire, dreams, and determination to study and know more of God's Word, I thought it would be worthwhile to approach Montemorelos University," Redondo recalled.

According to Lorena Neria, director of UM Virtual, Villalba contacted the institution about seven years ago to ask whether a person with visual disabilities could complete the theology program using adaptive technology.

Although faculty initially recognized the academic and technological challenges involved, Villalba began by taking a single course and eventually completed the entire degree program.

"He handles technology incredibly well," Neria said. "Nothing discourages him. He has an incredible entrepreneurial and courageous spirit."

Through ACUDE, an initiative created by UM Virtual to support students with disabilities, Villalba received assistance throughout his studies while gaining ministry experience in partnership with his local church. During graduation ceremonies, he was also presented with materials prepared in Braille in recognition of his academic achievement.

Sustained by Faith and Community

The years that followed brought both obstacles and unexpected support.

As he progressed through the program, financial resources often ran short. Yet, according to Villalba, church members, congregations, and supporters repeatedly stepped in to help cover tuition and other educational expenses.

Several times, he said, academic costs appeared impossible to meet, only to discover that someone had already provided the needed support.

Throughout the journey, his mother remained one of his strongest sources of encouragement and spiritual support.

Academic demands also presented challenges. Adapting course materials, navigating technology, and meeting university requirements required persistence and discipline. One of the most difficult stages came during the completion of his final research project, which underwent multiple revisions before receiving approval.

Despite the setbacks, Villalba said he remained committed to the calling that inspired him to pursue theology.

A Story of Inclusion and Service

Church leaders say Villalba's experience highlights the importance of creating educational opportunities for people with disabilities who feel called to ministry.

His story joins that of other Adventists with visual disabilities who have pursued theological education and Christian service, including Víctor Vergara of Caucasia, Colombia, who studied theology in the 1990s and now serves as a teacher of ethics and religious education.

For Redondo, Villalba's experience demonstrates how God continues to call individuals to ministry regardless of the obstacles they face.

"He may not have physical sight, but he has a vision that comes from heaven," Redondo said. "It allows him to see much farther than many of us."

Redondo also said Villalba's perseverance revealed qualities essential for ministry.

"The tremendous effort he made during these seven years shows that he has the strength and heart to be a valuable instrument in God's hands," he said.

Pastor Robinson Pelufo, who worked alongside Villalba in the Campohermoso district, described him as deeply committed to God, mission, discipleship, and local church ministry.

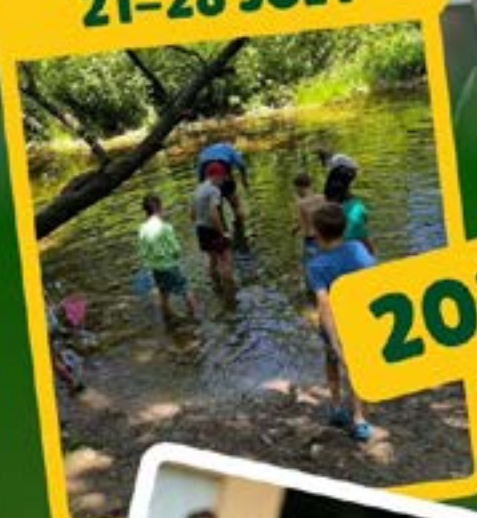

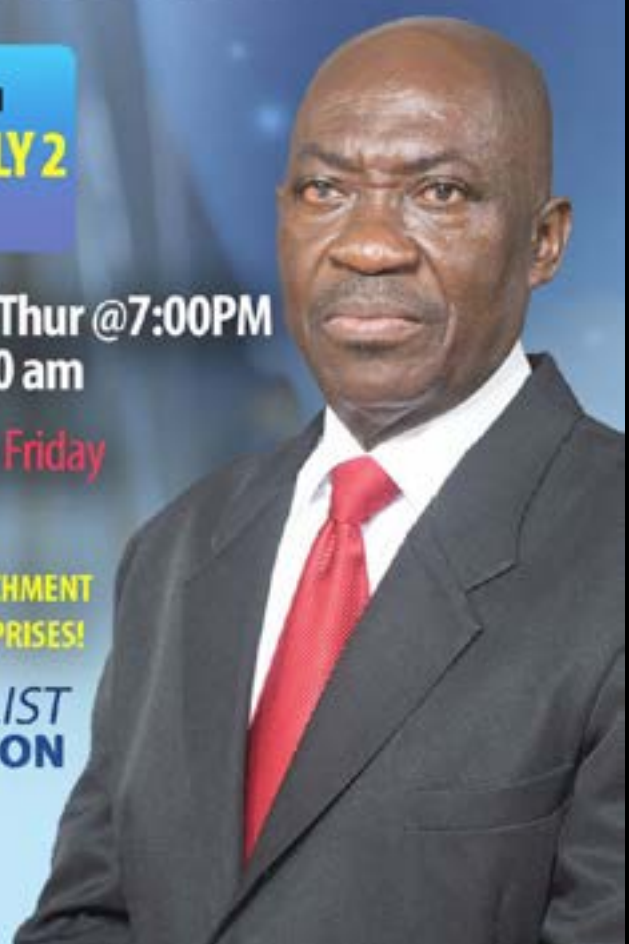

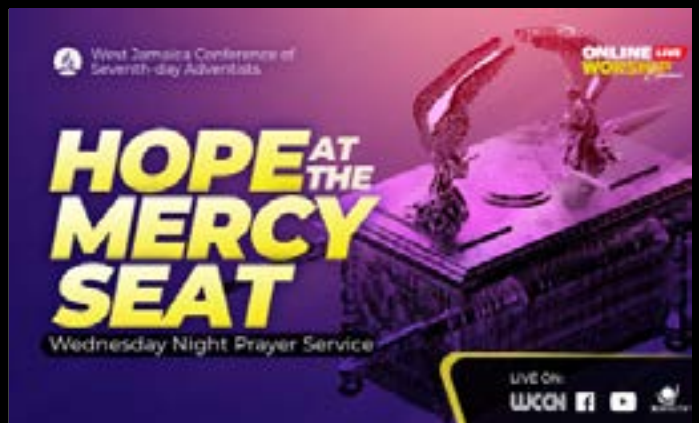
