PLANS AND PROJECTIONS

The Department of Women's Ministries exists to uphold, encourage, and challenge Seventh-day Adventist women in their pilgrimage as disciples of Jesus Christ and members of His world church. Every woman is called in this part of the vineyard to proclaim the love of Jesus to everyone, both in the church and in the wider community.

Our Mission: in the larger sense is common to all Christians—that of uplifting Christ in the church and in the world. But more specifically, we are called to:

1) Nurture

- elevate women as persons of inestimable worth because they have been created and redeemed.
- > enable women to deepen their faith and experience spiritual growth and renewal.
- build networks among women in your church in order to encourage bonds of friendship and mutual support and to create exchange of ideas and information.
- mentor younger Adventist women, encourage their involvement, and creating paths for them as they reach their potential in Christ.

2) Empower

- challenge each Adventist woman with her potential to complement the gifts given to other women and men as they work side by side to further the global mission of the Seventh-day Adventist Church.
- > Bring women's perspectives to the issues facing the world church.

3) Outreach

Seek expanding avenues of dynamic Christian service for women, that out of the fullness we as women have personally found in Jesus Christ, we may be empowered to share the Good News within our families, among our fellow believers, and in ever expanding circles in the unsaved world.

RESPONSIBILITIES AND DUTIES

The major duties and responsibilities of the Women's Ministries leader include the following:

- The leader will work with the church board to establish a committee. The committee should be composed of women interested in the broad spectrum of women's needs and concerns. The purpose of the committee is to brainstorm, develop strategies, and assist in planning programs and activities that relate to women's specific and varied needs.
- 2. The leader will work closely with her committee to survey the needs of the women in the local church and community. Survey questionnaires can be used to obtain this information.
- **3.** The leader will work with her committee and the pastor to develop and implement Women's Ministries programs or seminars, and network with existing support groups active in the church.
- **4.** It is the responsibility of the local church Women's Ministries leader to chair the Women's Ministries committee.
- 5. It is the leader's responsibility to keep the church membership informed of Women's Ministries and its contributions to church life.

Suggested Plans for the Women's Ministries Programme

Activities

Breaking the Evangelistic Glass Ceiling:

The Women's Ministries Department will be fully on board in the Breaking the Evangelistic Glass Ceiling for 2022. Some of the ways suggested are:

- Have Women's Ministries Leaders lead out in online/physical Bible studies
- Involve at least 50 women per church district to be consistent in weekly promotion of the programme.
- Have each woman identify at least one family member/neighbor/friend to send weekly texts or WhatsApp messages.
- Motivate the women to pray consistently for the person they are working with so that they can give their hearts to the Lord.
- Encourage the leaders to conduct seminars, whether online or in the church, for members and visitors. This will be used to identify persons of interest.
- Encourage the women to use the Google Form to register and list the persons of interest they are working with.
- Access the Bovi App in order to help spread the Gospel: bovi.app/iwillgo or bovi.app/healthy and happy.
