# WOMEN'S AND GEMS' CONVENTION: IGNITING A MISSION-DRIVEN FUTURE IN WEST JAMAICA

**M**ore than 600 women and young ladies gathered at the Seventh-day Adventist Conference Centre on June 13, 2026, for the annual West Jamaica Conference Women's and GEMS' Convention, a day dedicated to spiritual renewal, empowerment, and cross-generational mentorship under the theme, "Mission Driven: Rooted in the Word."

A centerpiece of the convention was the official launch of an expanded Women's Mentorship Programme, tailored to meet the needs of women across different stages of life.

"The programme is divided into three distinct groups: Phoebe for ages 18 to 35, Abigail for ages 36 to 49, and Lydia for those ages 50 and over," stated Elder Carol Smythe-James, Women and Children's Ministries Director for the West Jamaica Conference. "Many women face unique personal and spiritual challenges and often need encouragement and a trusted support system. This initiative will provide a safe space for women to connect, share, and grow together through intentional mentorship and fellowship."

Alongside this milestone launch, Elder Smythe-James announced strategic updates to the Girls of Eloquence, Morals, and Standards (GEMS) programme, narrowing its focus from its original 2014 bracket to ages 10 to 17 to provide more targeted, critical support for younger girls.

Building directly upon this foundation of mentorship and structural support, the spiritual centerpiece of the convention featured guest speaker Elder Claudette Baker-Archer Bailey.

Delivering a powerful message under the theme "Give Me Back My Church," Elder Bailey's dynamic address called the congregation to action. She challenged the women and GEMS to boldly reclaim their spiritual influence, strengthen their personal faith, and actively work toward restoring a culture of unity, holiness, and divine purpose within the wider church community.

This sentiment was strongly echoed by attendee Sis. Janette Brydson, who praised the impact of the message. "Her delivery was both doctrinally sound and deeply inspiring, providing clear spiritual direction that perfectly challenged the congregation to remain steadfast in scriptural truths," Brydson noted. "The message resonated deeply with me and reinforced the core mission of the church."

The afternoon session of the programme took an emotional, deeply moving turn when mentorship participant Danielle Clarke shared her personal testimony about the devastating impact of Hurricane Melissa on her home. Clarke recounted the severe loss and uncertainty following the storm but profoundly inspired the audience by declaring

her determination to press forward through faith rather than allowing the destruction to define her future.

The day's proceedings were further enriched by spirited singing and an exceptional musical ministry delivered by the Mass Choir. The event concluded on a high note, drawing widespread praise from those in attendance who felt the afternoon's programme truly resonated with them.

Sis. Lurline Jones-Craig stated, "I am so thoroughly impressed with the testimonies we heard today, and I want to encourage all the women to keep it up. I really enjoyed everything about today's program. Keep up the amazing work, sisters, and continue to let God use you to touch lives."

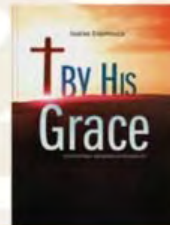
Ultimately, the convention achieved more than just a successful day of praise and thanksgiving; it ignited a renewed spirit of sisterhood and solidarity across the conference.

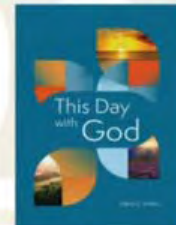

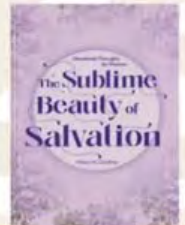

JAMES — A powerful milestone of dedicated leadership took center stage on June 20, 2026, as Master Guides from across the constituency gathered at the Glendevon Seventh-day Adventist Church for their annual Master Guide Rally. Held under the theme, “Master Guides: United in Faith, Connected in Service,” the day’s crowning highlight was a special recognition presentation dedicated to Area Coordinator Cecile Shippey-Dodd, honoring her more than 20 years of outstanding, consistent service as an Area Coordinator for the Master Guide Association in the West Jamaica Conference.

Shippey-Dodd was warmly commended by leadership and peers alike for providing steady leadership, wisdom, grace, and oversight to generations of Master Guides.

Jevon Smith, President of the Master Guide Association for St. James, spoke highly of her enduring impact: “Her presence has brought stability and clarity, ensuring that the ministry continues to grow with purpose and direction. Through changing and evolving leadership, she has remained constant. Her thoughtful counsel, insightful questions, and steady support have helped to shape and strengthen the Master Guide Association’s programs and initiatives in the

conference.”

## A Call to Purpose-Driven Character

The high-spirited event saw strong support from local Master Guides, Area Coordinators, and officials from both the local conference and the Jamaica Union. The keynote speaker for this year’s event was Pastor Dwayne Scott, Youth Director of the Jamaica Union Conference Bearing physical gifts for those in attendance, his message entitled “Born For This, Called, Set Apart and Sent” and based on Jeremiah 1:5-10—resonated deeply with the congregation.

During his address, Pastor Scott emphasized the foundational role of youth in the history of the movement:

“Young people and youth leaders play a significant role in God’s work. When Jesus was calling disciples to work with him to advance his mission, we notice that the Bible tells us that Jesus called young people to follow him. Many early pioneers were in their teens and twenties when they embraced the Adventist message. Their youthful energy, passion, and dedication were crucial in spreading the church’s teachings. There would be no Seventh-day Adventist Church were it not for the youth of the church and youth ministries.”

Underscoring three lessons from God's call to Jeremiah, Pastor Scott reminded the Master Guides that, first, God has a purpose for their lives and that their fundamental role is to serve the youth. Second, he noted that excuses will not do because God wants to use them for His glory. Finally, he exhorted them not to be afraid, reassuring them that when challenges arise as they give their best to the Master, God is always with them.

Pastor Kristoff Hyman, Associate Youth Director of the West Jamaica Conference, noted that the keynote message was incredibly well received. "Pastor Scott focused heavily on the youth and the Master Guides, challenging them not to just sit down, but to find something to do even when they are not asked," Pastor Hyman shared. He added that the report from the secretary regarding the current status of the association was particularly noteworthy: "The report from the secretary of the Master Guide Association recorded that there are more than 500 invested Master Guides across the conference. We hope, as the Youth Ministries Department, to grow that number as much as possible."

**Growth and Community Impact**

The spiritual focus shifted to direct community action in the afternoon with an outreach impact in the Rosemount community through vibrant singing and sharing of the word. Pastor Allan Green, Youth Ministry Director of the West Jamaica Conference, served as the main speaker. He delivered a unique presentation titled "Heaven's World Cup," which drew vibrant parallels between the 2026 World Cup and the ultimate gathering in heaven.

Grounded in the theme text of John 3:16, the presentation called on community members and local families to look to Jesus as their Saviour and intentionally build up their family altars. Pastor Green delivered a powerful message regarding Jesus' soon return, describing it as a heavenly World Cup uniting all nations, kindreds, tongues, and peoples.

The message was warmly received by the Rosemount community. At the conclusion of the appeal, several community members came forward for prayer, expressing high praise for the church's active presence and willingness to share the Word of God.

The Youth Ministries Department and the Master Guide Association of the West Jamaica Conference extend their deepest gratitude to Area Coordinator Cecile Shippey-Dodd for her decades of service, and to all the leaders, speakers, and members who supported this impactful

day of fellowship and ministry.

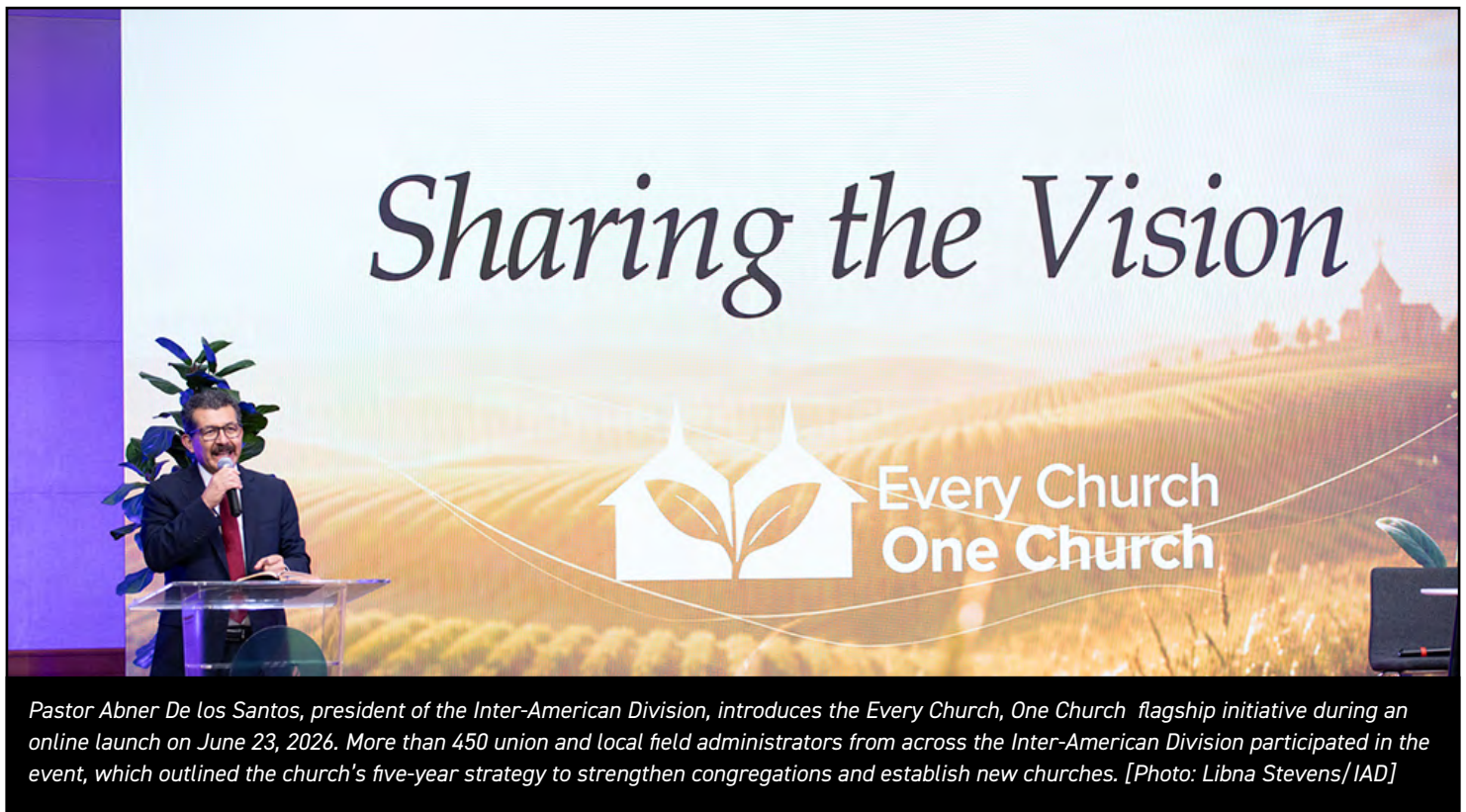

# 'Every Church, One Church' Initiative Calls Adventists Across Inter-America to Multiply Mission

**Five-year flagship initiative challenges every healthy congregation to plant another church by 2030.**

**T**he future growth of the Seventh-day Adventist Church in the Inter-American Division (IAD) will depend not on a handful of leaders, but on thousands of church members embracing their role in God's mission, said Pastor Abner De los Santos, president of the IAD, as he launched the division's Every Church, One Church initiative before more than 450 union and conference administrators gathered online on June 23.

"The challenge before us as pastors and church leaders is to mobilize the majority of the church to become involved in the mission," De los Santos said. "The church cannot focus only on preservation; it must focus on multiplication."

The five-year flagship initiative seeks to strengthen local congregations while equipping them to establish new congregations and engage more members in disciple-making throughout the territory.

"The objective is not simply to increase statistical numbers," De los Santos said. "The objective is for

every congregation to become spiritually healthy enough to give birth to another congregation.”

### Building on Two Decades of Growth

Supporting the initiative with historical data, Executive Secretary Pierre Caporal reported that the IAD organized 2,009 new churches during the past five years—nearly half of the 4,241 churches established since 2008. The growth, he said, reflects an unprecedented emphasis on congregational expansion across the territory.

Caporal highlighted the Chiapas Mexican Union and the Inter-Oceanic Mexican Union as leading models of church multiplication, accounting for more than 40 percent of all new churches organized during the past quinquennium. He also identified Puerto Rico, parts of the Caribbean, and major urban centers as regions where renewed church planting efforts will be especially important.

“The reality we are facing requires intervention,” Caporal said, outlining strategies to strengthen church planting in underserved and high-density communities.

Reinforcing the administration’s commitment to the initiative, IAD Treasurer Ivelisse Herrera said church planting must be viewed as one of the division’s most strategic investments.

“The mission does not advance on its own,” Herrera said. “It advances because of intentional and well-planned decisions. Every resource invested in planting a church is not an expense; it is an investment in God’s kingdom.”

Herrera said each new congregation creates opportunities for evangelism and discipleship while strengthening the church’s long-term sustainability. She announced that the division treasury is already developing funding criteria to support the initiative and urged union and conference treasurers to include church planting

in their long-term financial planning.

“This is a serious initiative that will require resources, not only during its initial phase, but well beyond this quinquennium,” Herrera said. “We are committed to assigning the resources needed to make Every Church, One Church a reality across Inter-America.”  
A Biblical Call to Multiply

Providing the biblical foundation for the initiative, Adventist Mission Director Samuel Telemaque reminded leaders that church planting is not merely a strategy but part of God’s original design for His church.

Telemaque said the initiative rests on two biblical principles: multiplication and spiritual maturity. Healthy congregations, he explained, naturally reproduce by making disciples and establishing new churches.

“Every Church, One Church presupposes that every congregation comes to full maturity,” he said. “When a church comes to full maturity in Christ, she will naturally want to reproduce.”

# MINDING THE STORM: COPING WITH HURRICANE ANXIETY

**P**hysical preparation is paramount during hurricane season. Securing yourself and your property is usually the main focus, and rightly so. However, based on our recent experience with Hurricane Melissa, we now realize that preparing mentally and emotionally is of equal importance for how we move forward.

Here are some quick tips to help build your psychological toolbox for this hurricane season:

**Anticipation:** Use your previous experience to anticipate what may be ahead. This helps to condition your mind and emotions, keeping you from becoming passive, trapped in denial, or distracted. Staying mentally active prevents you from being left in shock and traumatized in the aftermath of a powerful storm, as we saw with Melissa.

**Grounding:** Whenever you feel overwhelmed, practice grounding and relaxation exercises to help shift your thoughts away from dread and fear, and to regulate emotional overwhelm. Two great techniques to try are the 5-4-3-2-1 grounding method and box breathing.

- **The 5-4-3-2-1 Exercise:** This technique involves all of your senses. In a moment when you are feeling anxious, stop, take some deep breaths, and look around you. Identify five things you can

see, four things you can physically feel, three things you can hear, two things you can smell, and one thing you can taste. Moving slowly through this list grounds you in the present moment and shifts your mind away from the fear.

- **Box Breathing:** To do this, sit upright or stand. Inhale deeply through your nose for two to three seconds (depending on your lung capacity). Hold that breath for the exact same length of time, and then exhale slowly for that same count. Repeat this cycle until you feel your heart rate slow down and a sense of calm return.

**Social Support:** It is always better to be among people rather than by yourself during a hurricane. Knowing that you have others around you while the storm is raging helps you feel supported, insulated, and less afraid.

**Organize Activities:** Because you are likely to be without electricity during and after a storm, organize fun activities that don't require power. As Jamaicans, we love dominoes, cards, puzzles, and reading books. Planning these activities ahead of time helps pass the hours in a lighthearted way and keeps your spirits high during a time of potential destruction.

**Worship:** Pray and praise through it. Just like a hurricane has a calm eye at its center despite the chaos swirling around it, keeping God at the center of your life brings stability. Through the storm, He will grant you a peace that passes all understanding.

True hurricane preparedness means securing both your home and your peace of mind. By anticipating your emotional reactions, practicing grounding techniques, leaning on community support, and keeping faith at the center, you can weather any storm with resilience. This season, don't just pack your physical supplies—make sure your psychological toolbox is fully stocked too.
