FROM NOTES TO MINISTRY: FLANKER SDA CHURCH LAUNCHES INAUGURAL YOUTH MUSIC CAMP

MONTEGO BAY, ST. 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FROM NOTES TO MINISTRY: FLANKER SDA CHURCH LAUNCHES INAUGURAL YOUTH MUSIC CAMP

FLANKERS, ST. JAMES— The Seventh-day Adventist Church, Flankers, recently concluded its inaugural summer music camp, transforming two weeks of summer vacation into an impactful journey of musical discovery, personal retention, and youth ministry. Held from July 27 to August 7 under the theme “From Notes to Ministry” (inspired by Psalm 150), the camp set out to demonstrate that music is far more than a skill—it is a God-given gift meant to be developed in service to others.

What began as a leap of faith quickly grew beyond expectations. Organized without an initial fixed budget, the camp relied heavily on faith and grassroots community engagement. Though registration initially capped at 15 participants, word of mouth quickly spread—drawing campers from as far as the neighboring parish of Hanover. By the end of the first week, enrollment surged to 27 children. Following final skill assessments, 19 dedicated campers successfully met the advancement criteria to graduate..

Beyond Music: A Mission of Retention

For organizer Shackelia Campbell-Robinson, the vision for the camp was sparked by a desire to address church retention and reconnect with a former church member. Despite not being musically inclined herself, she felt called to move from identifying challenges within youth retention to creating a direct solution.

"You are always talking about the problem, but never coming up with a solution," Robinson recalled, reflecting on her motivation. "This is our solution... creating a space where children look forward to something. As the Bible says, if you train them, even if they leave, the word of God will never leave them."

Robinson added, "Growing up in the church, so many people poured into us, and now that we are in a position to pour into others, we have to."

A central win of the initiative was re-engaging a former church member to serve as an instructor, helping him rediscover his passion for mentorship and ministry through music.

"All along I was gifted, but this camp allowed me to realize how much I have to give back," he expressed.

Building Foundations and Unearthing Talent

Throughout the program, campers received instruction in foundational theory, vocal harmony, piano, and drums. Beyond technical proficiency, the curriculum prioritized nurturing confidence, discipline, teamwork, and spiritual purpose.

Instructors witnessed remarkable transformations in a short period. Drum instructor Fitzroy Robinson highlighted the mutual growth experienced by both teachers and students during the daily sessions.

"My experience at the camp was very enjoyable and rewarding," Fitzroy Robinson shared. "As a teacher, I learned the importance of patience, encouragement, discipline, and creating a fun learning environment. I am grateful for the opportunity to contribute to the children's growth."

Teaching young students to use their voices proved to be both a challenge and a learning experience for voice instructor Moyer-Lee Gordon. By meeting each child at their individual skill level, Gordon guided the students to recognize their unique strengths. For some, the journey uncovered a knack for music, while for others, it revealed a confidence in spoken delivery.

The impact was felt directly by the campers. "The music camp was good. I learned proper breathing techniques, important dos and don'ts for singing, and how to hit high notes," shared Dalia, one of the participating campers. "I love to sing; I just came to the camp to enhance my talent."

The camp culminated in a graduation ceremony where participants demonstrated their newfound abilities—playing full songs on the piano and drum kit, and performing synchronized vocal harmonies.

Looking Ahead

Weeks after the final notes were played, enthusiasm remained high among participants and parents alike, with many already inquiring about the next session.

"Building on this debut success, our plan is to make the music camp an annual program," said Robinson. "In the coming year, we want to expand the variety of instruments we offer and create a clear pathway for both our returning campers and newcomers to keep building on their foundational skills."

MONTEGO BAY, ST. JAMES — The West Jamaica Conference of Seventh-day Adventists strengthened its mission workforce with the training of Bible workers, lay preachers and child preachers during the Annual Lay Workers' and Child Preachers' Training Institute, held August 19–22, 2026, at the Seventh-day Adventist Conference Centre in Mount Salem.

Organized through the Personal Ministries and Children's Ministries departments, the four-day institute brought together participants for focused instruction and practical preparation for ministry across the Conference territory.

This year's Lay Workers' Training recorded its largest participation in a decade, with 73 Bible workers and 62 lay preachers and 182 child preachers receiving training in their respective areas of ministry.

Pastor Kimoy Allen, Personal Ministries Director of the West Jamaica Conference, described the turnout as an encouraging indication of members' readiness to become actively involved in mission.

"I am grateful and encouraged by the turnout of the lay workers. It's the largest contingent over the past 10 years. It's a signal that the men and women are charged up for mission. I want to thank the Administration, presenters, pastors, and churches for their support."

Young participants also marked a significant achievement through the Child Preachers' Training programme, coordinated by the Children's Ministries Department.

According to Mrs. Carol Smythe-James, Children's Ministries Director of the West Jamaica Conference, 102 children completed Level 1 of the programme, while another 80 successfully completed Level 2 and graduated.

"The Lay Workers' and Child Preachers' Training was a tremendous success," Smythe-James said. "We celebrate the 80 child preachers who successfully completed Level 2 and graduated, and we eagerly anticipate the progress of the 102 children who have completed Level 1."

She described the opportunity to train and mentor the children for service as a source of joy and thanked those whose efforts contributed to its success.

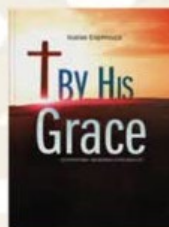

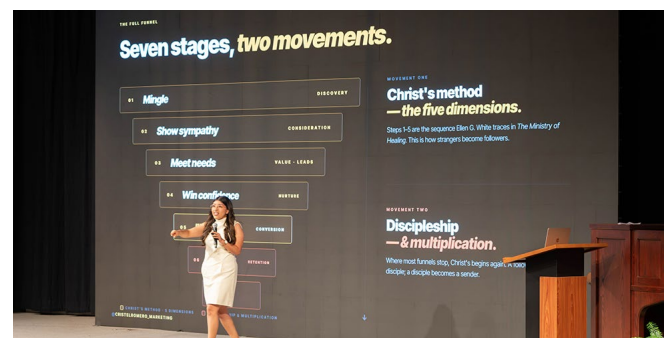
Content Creators Must Put People Before Metrics

Cristel Romero of Mexico urges creators to turn the trust they build online into meaningful relationships that meet needs and lead people toward Jesus.

For content creators accustomed to measuring their impact through views, followers, likes, and engagement, Cristel Romero, a content marketing strategist and audiovisual producer of the Inter-Oceanic Mexican Union, offered a different measure of success, that is the person behind the number.

Speaking to nearly 200 content creators and influencers during the Seventh-day Adventist Church's Creator Summit in Silver Spring, Maryland on July 23, Romero challenged participants to rethink how they use social media for mission, beginning with the trust audiences place in them and the needs of the people they hope to reach.

"Every day, you get a total stranger to let you in—into their home, into their screen, into their 2 a.m. can't-sleep scroll," Romero told participants. "They trust you. And now, trust is the scarcest resource on the planet. We need to do something with that trust."

That trust, she suggested, gives Christian creators an opportunity that extends far beyond producing

successful content. It can provide an opening to understand people, serve their needs, build relationships, and ultimately introduce them to Jesus.

Rethinking Success Online

Romero, whose work includes marketing and ministry, told participants that effective outreach begins by shifting attention away from what an organization or creator wants to promote and toward the people they are trying to serve.

She contrasted that approach with a numbers-driven mentality focused primarily on gaining more followers, views, reach, or other measurable results.

“You can make Christian content with a salesman’s mindset,” Romero warned. “You can use Jesus as your product, and you can use souls as your market. And I don’t want that.”

Instead, she encouraged creators to begin with their audience—their needs, fears, struggles, and barriers—and ask a fundamentally different question.

“What is this person going through?” Romero said. “And how can I serve them so well that they can trust me enough to let me talk about eternity?”

For Romero, that approach reflects the way Jesus reached people. Drawing on the familiar Adventist concept of Christ’s method of ministry, she pointed to a progression in which Jesus mingled with people, showed sympathy, ministered to their needs, gained their confidence, and then invited them to follow Him.

The order matters, she said.

“He showed His sympathy. He ministered to their needs. He won their confidence. And only then He said, ‘Follow me.’ Only then,” Romero emphasized. “This is a method. This is a sequence. It is a deliberate order.”

Moving Beyond Viral Content

Romero gave creators a seven-stage framework for turning digital contact into discipleship, connecting principles of content marketing with Christ’s method of reaching people. The process begins with mingling, showing sympathy, meeting needs, and winning confidence before moving toward an invitation to follow Christ and, ultimately, discipleship and multiplication.

For Romero, the framework challenges creators to see viral content as an entry point rather than the goal. A video may introduce someone to a creator or ministry, she said, but meaningful digital mission requires intentionally helping people move from initial awareness toward trust, relationship, and spiritual growth.

“Your viral videos are super good,” Romero said, referring to the first stage of the process. “We need to reach all people in all these stages.”

The progression also requires creators to move beyond simply producing content to becoming personally invested in the people they reach.

“Caring for people costs,” Romero said. “Caring for people costs your time. Caring for people costs your money. Caring for people costs your energy.”

That investment, she said, reflects Christ’s own willingness to enter humanity’s pain and give

THE GOLDEN RULE OF THE OLD TESTAMENT

DID YOU KNOW?

Did you know that long before modern legal constitutions guaranteed human rights, the ancient prophet Micah outlined the ultimate framework for social equity, legal fairness, and moral integrity? In his sermon, *The Golden Rule of the Old Testament* delivered at the Judiciary of Jamaica Assize Service to mark the commencement of the legal year, Pastor Adrian Cotterell highlighted how true societal transformation cannot be achieved through laws alone, but requires a collective commitment to the Old Testament's golden rule found in Micah 6:8: to do justly, love mercy, and walk humbly with God. Drawing historical parallels from Paul Bogle's march for justice during the 1865 Morant Bay Rebellion to modern struggles against class segregation and crime, Pastor Cotterell emphasized that ignoring the plight of the poor and vulnerable undermines the safety, security, and moral fabric of the entire nation.

The main focus of Pastor Cotterell's address is a passionate call for the legal fraternity, the church, government bodies, and citizens to actively unite in "Embracing Justice, Restoring Righteousness and Hope." He explained that true justice demands both legal fairness and character-driven integrity—protecting the marginalized, correcting systemic wrongs, and rejecting corrupt practices rather than relying on gated communities or superficial fixes. Furthermore, he paired justice with "Jesus-kind" mercy that forgives and restores, contrasting a vengeful digital culture with God's clean slate, and concluded that walking humbly with God means serving every individual as if serving Christ Himself. Ultimately, the sermon serves as a clarion call for a modern-day "Micah for Jamaica" to speak truth to power and ensure that constitutional rights are actively lived out through daily service and righteousness.

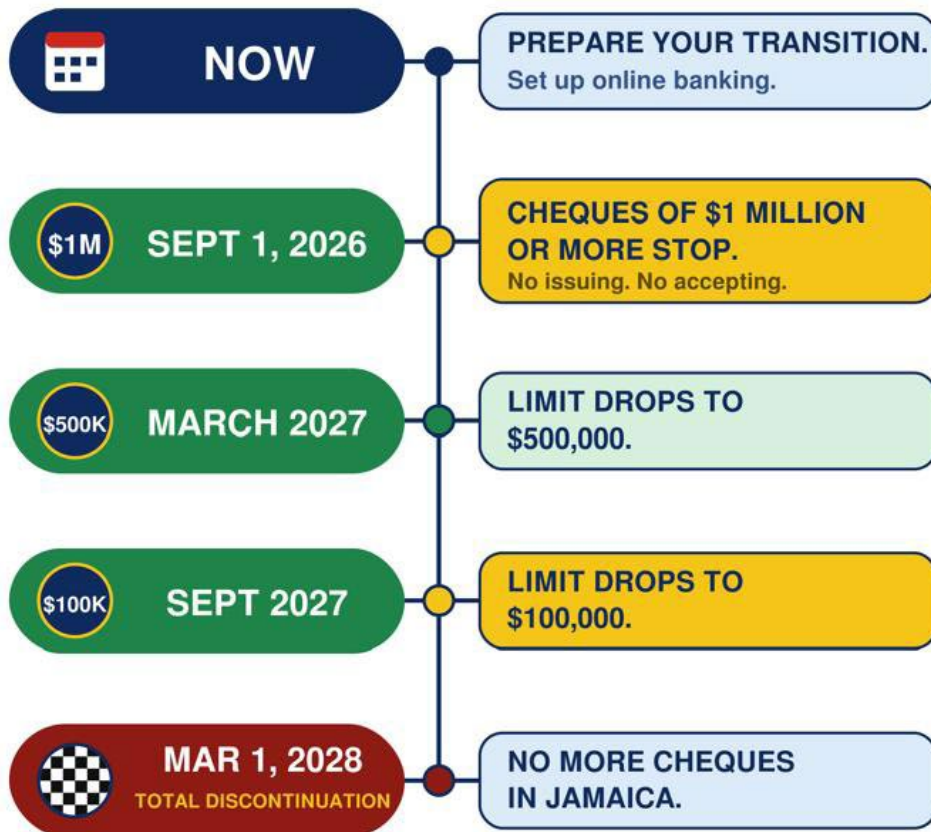

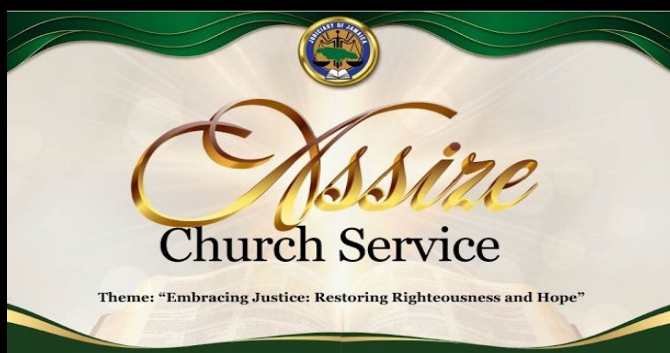
